## Assumption of the Blessed Virgin

Mary's visit to Elizabeth was certainly a surprise. Pregnant with Jesus, she goes to visit her older kinswoman, Elizabeth, who is also pregnant and awaiting the birth of John, and Elizabeth rejoices at Mary's arrival. Mary's response to Elizabeth's greeting, the Magnificat, is believed by most biblical scholars to be a canticle of early Jewish Christian composition that Luke inserted into his Gospel because the hymn was so revered in his community. Mary's plight - alone, scared, running for safety - was echoed in Luke's own community after the fall of Jerusalem. The hymn, placed on Mary's lips, is a reminder of how God turns things around for those who remain faithful. God lifts up the lowly and comes to the help of his servants.

The Magnificat, which Luke places on Mary's lips, has been a part of Christian evening prayer for centuries, reminding believers that at the end of the day all that has taken place, the blessings and the challenges, are caught up in God, who remembers his promise of mercy in every generation.

### — Magnificat —

*My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord;  
My spirit rejoices in God my Savior  
For he has looked upon his lowly servant.*

**From this day all generations will call me blessed;  
The Almighty has done great things for me,  
And holy is his Name.**

**He has shown the strength of his arm,  
And has scattered the proud in their conceit.**

**He has cast down the mighty from their thrones,  
And has lifted up the lowly.**

**He has filled the hungry with good things,  
And the rich he has sent away empty.**

**He has come to the help of his servant Israel  
For he has remembered his promise of mercy,**

**The promise he made to our fathers,  
To Abraham and his children for ever.**

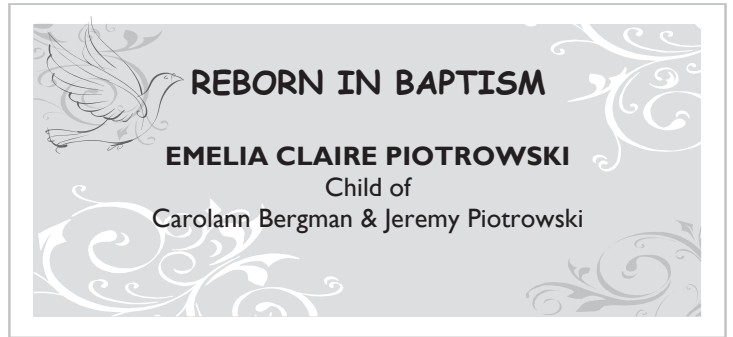

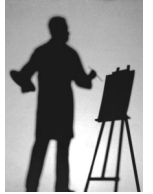

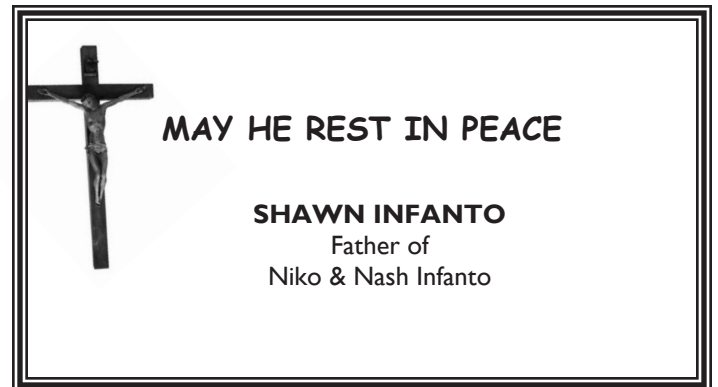

## Maintenance News From Your Finance Committee

We informed you earlier in the summer that we will be replacing the roof on the north side of the main church (Tabernacle side) and replacing the air conditioning units on the roof at the same time. We finally have a starting time of mid-September. The roof is twenty years old and the a/c units are 15 years old...both have outlived their warranties.

We have also been working on the Parish Center this summer. The Parish Center was dedicated in 1981 and some areas were really showing their age. In the past few years we have replaced the air conditioners/heater unit as well as some smaller projects over the years inside and outside.

This past year we replaced the tile in the entryway, the restrooms, the changing rooms, the office area and the kitchen. Our summer crew did this - and a few young men working in our summer crew learned a new trade with the help of our maintenance managers - Jack Beckett and Mike Lee. We also replaced the counters in the kitchen and will be replacing the overhead lights this week. The old sodium based lights were state of the art 30-plus years ago—but are now on the endangered species list. Very expensive to buy and use. We will replace with fluorescents which will also give us a discount from DP&L for "going green" plus we will have a reduced monthly bill. Another nice feature of the new lights is that they will come on when the gym is in use and automatically go off when there is no movement after a certain amount of time.

Many thanks to our Athletic Assn who offered to donate \$3,000 per year for the next 3 years to help their parish pay for these updates and to thank the parish for use of the gym for practices and their annual Fish Fry.

### THE GOOD NEWS

A Canaanite woman, despised by Jews, actually comes to Jesus hungry for "more"-she wants healing for her tormented daughter. The apostles just want her gone. They miss Jesus' core message: it is the God-given right of every starving, emotionally needy, or ill person to ask for "more"! But when a poor person asks us for money, don't we usually ask "Why doesn't he have a job? Is he lazy? Will he just spend it on drink?"

Even more, we feel that the "asker" is crossing some boundary that they have no right to cross, as if we're the "have", and they are a "have-not" asking for more than they are entitled to.

What were the apostles trying to protect Jesus from by saying "Send her away?" Maybe Jesus was using this as a "teachable moment" to show us that God's universal love and healing ARE the original plan. Food, shelter, warmth and care are the right expectation of every person. WE set up false boundaries of "have" and "have not", out of fear and self-protection.

Distinctions between people arrived once evil entered the world. But for God, there are still no "haves" or "have nots". We deny God's reality when we do not cry out for the Oneness God wants for all of us. Let us wail and cry, and beg for "MORE" for all members of our Oneness who desperately need it!
