A Reflection on Today's Gospel

Jesus' disciples must have felt intense fear on the lake as their boat was tossed around in the dark. Thick clouds would have covered any moon and no lights from the shore would have been visible since tiny oil lamps would not penetrate the darkness that far out. We know the fear a tornado can cause for those in a secure home as they rush to the basement to seek shelter. Imagine being on a lake in a small boat tossed about by the waves. Even skilled fishermen like Peter and Andrew and James and John would have been afraid.

In that storm, Jesus comes to calm the waves and give hope to his disciples. He is also the One who comes to us in the great storms of our own lives. When we are tossed about by the problems, fears, difficulties, and tragedies of life, Jesus is there to give us hope. Like the passing thunderstorm, we still have to deal with the effects of life's problems. They don't magically go away. But Christ is there to see us through, even as we recover from whatever storm battered our life. His words to us are the same as those addressed to the disciples: "Take courage, it is I; do not be afraid."

Summer is rapidly coming to an end as we get into the month of August. An important event for Catholics in August is the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. This feast will be celebrated next Monday, August 15th. Our Bishops gave us guidelines several years ago that when a holyday of obligation occurs on a Saturday, Sunday or Monday, the obligation for Mass attendance is not required. However, that doesn't mean we cannot attend Mass on our own that day. Honor Mary next Monday by attending our noon Mass on Monday...or Mass at one of our neighboring parishes. Mary is a great comfort and example to all of us. Please pray for vocations.

THE GOOD NEWS

Remember that old song from 1960, *The Sounds of Silence*? It was written when President Kennedy was assassinated. The people felt such darkness and despair. In scary times of fear and desperation, we often go into silence to find God and security; but today the gospel shows us a different approach to finding peace.

The apostles' boat is anything but silent - they're being tossed wildly by wind and storm, praying for help, when suddenly Jesus is walking toward them. He comes in the very heart of the crisis, just as he does when we are in "the perfect storm" of chaos and disaster in our own lives.

When our faith is wavering the most, and we're least in control of things, we hear Jesus' call: *"Come to me. Do what must be done."* So we have to lift both legs over the side and start walking on water toward the Body of Christ.

The best way to find God in times of stress is to step out of our comfort zone and make an effort to be Christ for others -bringing more people into our circle of love and life. Yes, it's great to have abundant life with our friends and families. But don't keep it to yourselves - bring it back to the Body of Christ. Put a new leaf in your table and ask someone to dinner tonight!
