


# **ANNUAL REPORT**

In March, the Church even closed its doors to the public for 10 weeks.

While we continued to celebrate and stream our Masses every day, I know that our people really missed the opportunity to come to Church and receive the Blessed Sacrament. Some are still unable to safely come to Church and still long for the Blessed Sacrament. This is why we have been praying the prayer for Spiritual Communion at every Mass.

In spite of the smaller numbers at Mass, our collections have only seen a small decline. Not only have our parishioners continued to step up and contribute, many have signed up for on-line giving during this time of pandemic. What a great witness!

While we ran a deficit last year, some of this was off set through generous bequests. In addition, we continue to maintain the physical plant. Last summer we completed a major capital project by replacing the entire heating system in the school.

None of this would be possible if it weren't for the good people of St. Albert who continue to share their gifts even in the midst of these difficult times.

Once upon a time, there was a parishioner who said to their pastor: *"I know that we are supposed to tithe, but I'm confused about something. Am I supposed to tithe off of my gross pay or net pay – that is after taxes."* The pastor responded: "That depends. Do you want God's blessings before or after taxes?"

You have given much of yourselves during these "taxing" times and I am grateful. I am grateful for how you have blessed St. Albert. I pray that God blesses you 10 fold.

# **From Finance Council**

In the past year, with your support and the support of our priests, the parish staff, and teachers and volunteers, we have been able to reasonably continue the focus on our mission and most importantly our liturgy.

Additionally, again with your support and the help of bequests, we were able to continue to make needed improvements, additions and repairs to our parish facilities:

• New cafeteria tables and chairs

Storm drain repair

Parking lot purchase and related fees and repairs

Asbestos abatement in the Spirit Center and School

- Church renovation study
- HVAC study
- Computer and technology upgrades
- Tree Removal
- Rectory and church painting
- Roof and window repairs
- New hot water compression tank
- Cameras for security system
- New lawn mowers

In addition to the above, we did a complete update of the boilers and HVAC system in the school at a cost of \$652,000. The old system was becoming very unreliable and was continuing to be costly to repair. The funding will come from the capital fund in the new fiscal year. Also, we want to point out that we did receive a PPP Loan through the Care Act. As we still need to apply and receive forgiveness of the loan, the balance has remained untouched. Hopefully, we will be successful having the loan forgiven and the monies will be available for use in the future.

We continue to be thankful for your continued support of the mission of Saint Albert the Great and to be able fulfill the needs of the Parish.





## Worshiping during Covid19

Our world changed in March of 2020. Our Lenten activities were cut short; our small faith groups were stopped, Benediction / Adoration and Stations of the Cross all stopped. Our church and school were shut down. Businesses and stores all shut down. It is times that we have never seen before. However, St. Albert the Great found ways to continue to worship and Bring Church to You.

Our Masses have always been streamed with our **StreamSpot**—and it is a good thing! Our StreamSpot rate of parishioners viewing Mass online skyrocketed. See page 8. After the Good Friday Noon Mass, Fr. Chris Worland, with the crucifix in hand, **walked the neighborhood** behind St. Albert the Great. We had over 50 volunteers be involved in our **Parishioner Outreach Project**, where we called every parishioner to ask how they were and if they had any prayer intentions. We had **Helping Hands**, where parishioner volunteers would help other vulnerable parishioners to get groceries or medicines. Fr. Chris provided a Podcast presentation for guidance to cope with Covid.

We held outside **Rosary Rallies**, with great turn outs! Both times, our parking lot was filled with cars! And we held an outside **Liturgy of the Word**, which included a blessing for any 2020 graduates. We had **Drive Up Confessions**, and **opened our Church** (limited hours) for quiet prayer.

Our Religious Education, Youth Ministry, and RCIA groups all held **virtual meetings through Zoom**, allowing for continued faith formation. Online resources were provided on our website for ideas on *Being Church at Home*. We held an **outside graduation** for our 8th graders, which included a blow up screen and slideshow.

In addition to the above, our service to others did not stop. Our Monthly Food Collection flourished with people bringing canned goods and food items. Our Meals for the Homeless did not delay with people providing casseroles and fruit / cookies for St. Vincent de Paul Shelter. Our annual Blood Drive was not postponed, with people coming out to much needed blood.

## **Parish Pastoral Council**

As part of our goal to improve welcoming and encourage new membership, our Parish Council initiated the plan for new **Welcome Videos** for our **Parish and School**. Fr. Chris and Sherry Gabert both did great jobs in their roles for these videos. These videos were designed for our website (Parish and School homepages); however, we published them using all communication devices, such as social media and our Gathering Space TV.

# **Advent Holy Hour**



With seminarian Broderick Witt and Deacon Dick Strominger, we held our first (in a long time) Advent Holy Hour. This event was a collaboration of many staff members, including RE, Music, Communications, Events, Youth Ministry, and Faith Formation.

Benediction and Adoration were both a part of this Holy Hour, along with hymns and praise.



### **Lenten Morning of Reflection**

During Lent of 2020, a Lenten Morning of Reflection was held in the Spirit Center. About 50 parishioners attended to listen to Fr. Pat Welsh and Deacon Dick Strominger talk about the Sacrament of Healing. Small group discussions were held in between the presentations.

### **Sensory Friendly Masses**

During the fiscal year of 2019, Sensory Friendly Masses were initiated by the Archdiocese in an effort to be more inclusive with special needs. St. Albert the

### **Mass of Remembrance / Anointing of the Sick**

In September of 2019, we celebrated the sacrament of **Anointing of the Sick**. Fr. Chris and Fr. Pat prayed with 50 parishioners for healing and strength. In November of 2019, in coordination with All Souls Day, we held our annual **Mass of Remembrance** where names of our beloved dead were read with a candle burning in memory.



### **Pro Life**

Pro Life Group had another successful fiscal year. In October, the team put out **30 white crosses** in front of Church to represent the aborted babies. They also held a **Baby Jesus Shower**, with items being donated to Elizabeth's New Life Center. In January, they held the traditional **Pro Life Candle Sale**, with all proceeds again going to Elizabeth's New Life Center. In March, the **40 Days of Life campaign** was interrupted with the Covid19 pandemic.

# The Ark of the Covenant Praesidium of the Legion of Mary

Before the pandemic, the group's usual service included taking communion on Wednesdays to the Oaks of West Kettering to Catholics over the year, and hosting Christmas Mass there, as well as **home visits** to some of our 205 Legion of Mary auxiliaries. The primary evangelization effort was organizing 23 volunteers to staff a free **Catholic Information Booth** for 12 hours a day at the Montgomery County Fair, giving away many sacramental items, such as 281 rosaries with explanations. To keep Catholics in the Church, the Legion of Mary 1) hosted a Birthday Party for Our Lady with 27 present, 2) co-hosted a Parish Coffee & Donuts with Catholic literature,



3) provided free Miraculous Medals and religious prizes at the parish picnic, as well as 4) hosting sixteen people for an eight-week Marian Consecration Study Group seminar that started February of 2020, in the Spirit Center.

Once the pandemic suspended in-person events, we continued to meet weekly by video and phone conference. Each week we wrote personal letters to the eight Catholics and two non-Catholics we had been visiting previously at the nursing home. The Marian Consecration group shifted to video conference to finish in March of 2020. We made phone calls for the parish census, phoned our auxiliaries monthly, hosted a monthly video conference for our auxiliaries, repaired rosaries, and sorted donated materials.

# WE LEARN



### School / Education Commission



The fiscal year of our school started out with the annual *Run with the STAGS* event, and the **"Back to School" Coffee & Donuts** with the help of PTO and Education Commission. Highlights of the fiscal year were

### Vocations

During Vocations Awareness Week, the School, Youth Ministry and RE combined forces for a **Vocations Panel**, which included priests, nuns, seminarians and married couples. The 4th and 5th grades in the school also had a visit from Fr. Steve Dos Santos from the Missionaries of the Precious Blood. Through these conversations, the students were exposed to various ways in which they can serve God by living their vocations.

**PTO PTO's revenue for the fiscal year was \$17,276.83**. We were unable to do major spring fundraiser due to the pandemic that would have incorporated the Walkathon, Knollwood gift cards, and miscellaneous events. The revenue that was made is broken down as follows: Christmas Tree Sales (profit of \$8,088), Pie Sale (\$3,915), Kroger Rewards (\$2,001), Spirit Days (\$1,788), Amazon (\$216), Hoedown (\$593), Penguin Patch (\$146), Box Tops (\$36, and Chipotle fundraiser (\$491).





# **Religious Education**

The Religious Education department offers faith formation on Sunday mornings for ages 3 years - 8th grade; preparation for the Sacraments of First Communion, First Reconciliation, and Confirmation; Mass server training; and Totus Tuus Vacation Bible School.

Over the past fiscal year, over **250 students attended Sunday morning religious education classes** and **98 students prepared for Sacraments**. Some of the highlights of the year include:

-our annual tradition of **Feeding 1000**, where candidates and sponsors prepared 100 casseroles for St. Vincent DePaul

-a new tradition of an **All Saints' day parade** during Sunday morning classes and -the kick-off of **Childrens' Liturgy of the Word during Lent.** 

Embracing the challenges and opportunities offered by the pandemic, we offered **virtual Children's Liturgy of the Word** and **virtual religious education sessions** with special guests seminarian Brody Witt and Fr. Chris. These adaptations have opened the doors to the **online religious education** and **family catechesis** options that we are able to offer for 2020-2021.

### **Athletic Association**

WELEARN The Fish Fry is the primary method for funding the Athletics program for parishioners and students. St Albert offers six different sports for kids age Pre-K through 8th grade. These funds help us offer sports at a low cost to our families, to keep facilities and equipment updated, and to help fund other Parish projects. With over 200 volunteers and sponsors in 2020, we were able to host the event in February prior to the impact of the pandemic to help raise \$22,090 after expenses with 10% of that money going directly back to the Parish, \$10,000 used to fund Sports programs, and the rest going into reserves for future needs or Parish projects.

# **Adult Faith Formation**



Throughout this fiscal year, the adult faith formation has been strong. Many book studies and bible studies were conducted, including small faith groups that started at the beginning of Lent. Women's Book Study group completed several books. Highlights were a book about Compassion & Contemplation, The Joy of the Gospel, and The book of Joy. Some highlights of Wednesday Evening Bible Study are a study on the book of Job and a 6 week study called The Way part 1. During Lent, small groups were formed, studying The Joy of the Gospel, which was giving out at Christmas time. However, the study was cut short due to the covid19 pandemic.



### **Social Justice in Action**

# RCIA



This has been an exceptional year for all, including those coming into the Church. We welcomed two baptized Christians into the Church in August 2029 and in January 2020. After what seemed like the longest Lent ever our elect was baptized and two already baptized candidates were fully initiated into the Church on July 5, 2020. A rising 9th grader joined them in celebrating the Sacrament of Confirmation; liturgically correct/covid-style.

### SAYM Youth Ministry

We have had an amazing year in Youth Ministry. We offered meetings every week for junior high and high school students to gather, pray, and celebrate their

identity as disciples of Christ. We also increased our extracurricular activities, hosting extra events such as bonfires, lock ins, and adoration nights for teens to gather for prayer, service, or community building.

Our Adult Volunteer team grew from 3 to 7 members, allowing us to increase and diversify our



opportunities to meet. Before the pandemic moved us to an online format, we were averaging 10-15 high school teens and 20-25 junior high teens at each meeting! We are a community that meets often and regularly, accepts teens from all walks of life, and provides mentorship from a strong team of faithful adult volunteers. # Garden Guild



We are dedicated to growing food locally using organic methods, in an effort to feed our families, parish and the local hungry. Since 2010, the guild has raised and donated \$26079.00 This past year the Guild made a donation of \$3000.00 to the St Albert's St Vincent committee to assist those in need in our parish community. These donations are made possible from our Farmer's Market sales and the generous donation of time and monies from guild members and supportive parishioners. The Guild continues its efforts in working with many other parish groups and our school throughout the year. We participated in the Artisan Fest, held our annual Seed Give Away and started the Adopt A Flowerbed program to help keep our parish grounds looking their best. We continue to help our youths with their service hours and the Eagle Scouts with projects.

## St. Vincent de Paul St. Albert the Great Conference

The members of the St. Albert the Great St. Vincent de Paul Conference are often called to participate personally and directly in helping the needy by person-to-person contact and by the gift of one's heart and friendship. The COVID-19 virus implications have forced us to come up with innovative ways to reach our neighbors in need.

# In the last fiscal year, we have provided food (\$4,227), utilities (\$8,800), rent (\$14,600) furniture/appliances (\$1,081) totally \$28,758 in relief to our needy neighbors.

The generous donations from parish members and the parish collection has greatly supported our efforts. In addition, we are working closely with the Miami Valley Community Action Partnership to leverage federal financial support in addressing the large bills neighbors have accumulated. This combined with moratoriums on eviction and utility shut-offs has greatly assisted the many neighbors that are now unemployed and without income.





# **Spirits & Socials**

New this fiscal year, our Event Coordinator developed Spirits & Socials, community building events. In October 2019, an estimated 60 parishioners purchased tickets to our first **Bourbon Tasting**. They sampled from 11 different bourbons, listened to live music, ate some delicious food, and met some new friends. A big thank you to Rick Vogel for the StAG customized bourbon glasses for all who bought a ticket to this event and to all who sponsored & donated the bottles!

In November 2019, St. Albert Parishioners shopped and supported local vendors at our **Artisan Fest** held in the Parish Center. Our very own Garden Guild sold their delicious pesto among many other treats!
