THE PEOPLE OF GOD

The term '**People of God**' is often used to describe the baptized members of the Church who are not ordained. There is an interrelationship between the ordained and non-ordained ministries because every ministry of the whole Church is a participation in the one priesthood of Christ.

The **People of God** may serve the Church in any number of particular ministries. The Second Vatican Council encouraged their 'full, conscious and active participation':

The Church earnestly desires that all the faithful be led to that full, conscious, and active participation in liturgical celebrations called for by the very nature of the liturgy. Such participation ... is their right and duty by reason of their baptism.

- Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, 1963 n. 14

In addition to the roles of ordained clergy and staff, lay members are necessary in the preparation and execution of meaningful, organized, and inclusive sacramental celebrations, which are an encounter with God.

These members are all part of the Worship Commission.



WORK OF THE PEOPLE

Through the Worship Commission, the people of God are called to participate in the **Work of the People** in special, specific ways. The members serve in a variety of ministries, Liturgical Ministries, that supports our daily and weekly liturgies.

Examples are altar servers, lectors, extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion, cantors, choir members, instrumentalists, leaders of song and ushers. Others contribute their time and talent to planning and organizing the liturgy, to keeping the church and the vestments, vessels and appointments clean and well-ordered or to providing decorations that reflect the spirit of the liturgical feast or season.

Any and all persons who assist in the Liturgical Ministries above, in any role, are members of the Worship Commission. **However, these members are called** "*members at large.*"

Members at large are invited to attend the monthly Leadership Meetings, but are NOT required.

MASS COORDINATORS / SACRISTANS



The Mass Coordinator, who may be high school aged or older, are responsible for the physical background supporting the celebration of the Mass. The duties include setting up the altar area for Mass, and then cleaning the communion vessels after Mass. Training will be provided with a one-time training session, which will be before or after the 11am Mass in the Lower Sacristy.

DURING THE MASS liturgical ministries

USHERS

The ushers greet people in a welcoming manner as they arrive at the church. They also fill the bulletin bins and assist any parishioner that may need help.

More specifically during the Mass, they select volunteers to bring up the gifts, perform the collection, and dismiss the pews for communion. At times, they might be asked to do an attendance count.

The goal would be to have four ushers on the church side and two ushers on the chapel side.

LECTORS



The lectors (readers) play an important role in the Liturgy of the Word as they proclaim and share the Word of God with the people gathered. Lectors are scheduled once a month; however, you have opportunity to read more as a sub, which is often needed. There is a one-time training to go over procedures, which takes about 30 minutes.

ALTAR SERVERS

The altar servers help the Priest throughout the liturgy. **Anyone who has received their First Holy Communion and is trained can be an altar server.** At the beginning of the Mass the altar servers process into the church with the Priest, and they bring religious symbols such as the cross or candles into the sacred space. During the Preparation of the Gifts, the altar servers stand either side of the Priest at the front of the altar to receive the gifts. They then take the gifts and the water used by the Priest to the altar table.



Is there a need for more participation in this ministry

We encourage our School & RE students to be servers at weekend Masses.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS

Extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion assist the Priest to prepare and distribute the bread and wine to the people during the Liturgy of the Eucharist. This involves bringing the hosts from the tabernacle to the altar after the Lamb of God is sung or spoken.

They stand at the altar with the Priest, pray with the assembly and reverently distribute the bread or wine to the people.

We encourage our newly confirmed students to become a part of this wonderful and fulfilling ministry.



Is there a need for more participation in this ministry

Yes, there is a need for more distributors at all Masses. A one-time training session is required. If you were previously a distributor, no new training is required.

MUSIC

The liturgical musicians help the people to respond through music and song during the Mass. They lead the assembly at key points in the liturgy such as the Entrance Procession, the Psalm, the Alleluia, the Eucharistic Prayer, and Communion. The liturgical musicians could be those who sing, play instruments, and join with others in a choir. Being able to read music is a plus, but not a requirement.
