

We present to you **Six Ways You Can Make Your Parish Better.**Today, parishioners can feel a true sense of ownership in their parish.
That means looking at your parish as more than just a place where you go to Mass.

A parish can be

- † A sacred place where the human and the divine meet; where young and old follow Christ.
- † A place where people receive spiritual nourishment, guidance, inspiration, and strength, not from only the priests, but from other members of the parish.
- † A spiritual home where people share in each other's joys, support each other in times of sorrow, offer support to those who are struggling, and help to heal anyone who feels battered or broken by life's trails and tragedies.
- † A social place where people make friends, reach out to those less fortunate, and invite others to become part of a community of believers who try their best to live the Gospel message.

My hope is that St. Albert the Great is already all of this to you and more.

However, even the best parishes can become even better when parishioners take an active interest in making the parish grow and prosper. Here are six ways to do just that!

Use your gifts & talents for the good of the parish.

"What shall I render to the Lord for all His bounty to me? Ps. 116:12

God has given each person unique gifts and talents are intended to be shared.

Do you like public speaking? You could be a Lector. If you are an outgoing person, you could be an usher or greeter. You can share your deep devotion to the Eucharist by becoming an Eucharistic Distributer or take Communion to the homebound.

If you play an instrument or sing, join the Music Ministry.

Maybe you are a teacher and can help with Religious Education.

Any expertise like business, finance, grant writing, photography, or gardening can find a place in the parish. You might even have an idea for a new ministry, support group or event, and your energy can help other people get excited and involved.

Bottom, Going Clockwise:

Our Liturgies would not be complete without the Lay People who serve as Coordinators, Readers, Ushers, Servers, Eucharistic Distributors, and Musicians; We provide assistance to St. Vincent de Paul and Catholic Social Services with our Meals for the Homeless and Monthly Food Collection; We host two Blood Drives per year; Our Garden Guild grows and sells produce with all the proceeds going to St. Vincent de Paul and to feed local hungry; Parishioners assist with building a house for a local family in Catch the Building Spirit.


