In **November**, a farmhouse was donated and moved from Far Hills Avenue to the Church property: the Rectory


## CELEBRATING MILESTONES 1940-1949




In October, Fr. James Byrne is assigned as new Pastor of St. Albert the Great. Focus on: -Foreign & home ministries -Social justice -Tithing



Fr. Gary Aultz is ordained in Oklahoma. He returned to us after retirement, and continues to serve the parish






