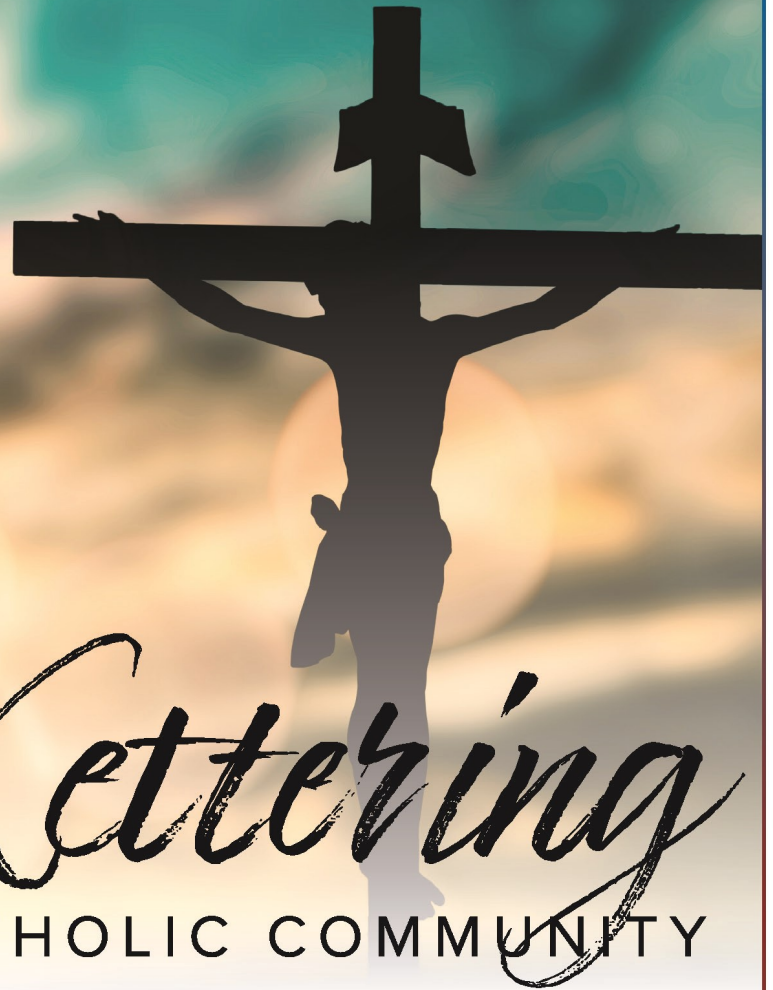

Father Ed Pratt, Pastor



Labor Day...Work is Part of Our Identity... Priest as Vocation

Many of you know that I was a Director of Human Resources prior to entering seminary. I worked in HR in both the for profit and nonprofit settings. That's been over 20 years ago and the field has changed a lot, but one thing that is still true is that work is a big part of our lives.

When you meet someone, after asking their name, what is one of the first questions you ask—

"What do you do?" is very common. Our occupation, even if retired, is still part of who we are and part of our identity. Occupation versus vocation is something to consider. For those who are married, your vocation is to be a faithful and faith-filled spouse and parent. If you change occupations, you still have that vocation. As a priest, it takes prayer and discernment to determine the depth of how my occupation and vocation are blended and what is the right balance. This has been a real challenge over the last year as pastor of all three large parishes. Many weeks I feel that I spend more time being an administrator and less time being a priest. I find that frustrating. I would much rather spend time preparing homilies, providing sacraments, being a priestly presence and presiding at Mass than worrying about the budget, staff issues or our facilities. I trust that ministerial roles being the priority for our priests is what you want as well.

As time and changes affect our Church, not just our Kettering Catholic Community, we have to adjust and realize that our priests cannot do everything they used to do when each parish had 2 or more priests assigned. To have expectations to continue doing things as we have always done in the past will certainly (and already has) lead to burnout for priests.

We are blessed with gifted and talented staff members who can take care of just about everything in our parishes, allowing our priests to be sacramental and pastoral ministers versus administrators. I know I have surprised some people when they request something of me and my response is "There is a staff member much better suited than I am to assist you with that need."

Please accept such statements as confidence in the staff and as a priest wanting to make sacramental and pastoral ministry my greatest priority.

As I look at my work this Labor Day, I truly feel called and love being a sacramental priest. I will accept some of the related administrative duties as necessary knowing that all are ready to accept new ways of being Church. Thanks to our gifted staff members!

Let's continue on our journey with God and one another.

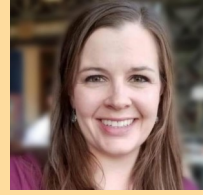

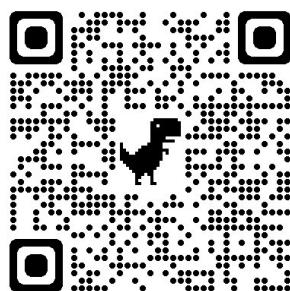

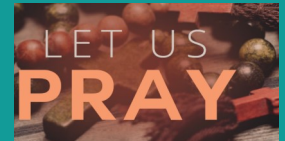
