## STAFF REFLECTION



## Father Chibueze Asiegbulem Parochial Vicar

It was Martin Heidegger, the famous German philosopher, that said, "In calling man to thinking, being has endowed the nature of man with a thinking that's thankful, a thinking that recalls and gives thanks. A thoughtful, thankful, thinking man sees himself as beholden and as indebted." It is based on this quote that I would like to acknowledge the wonderful gifts given to our staff during the Christmas holiday. We all appreciate those who donated flowers and cash to our family of parishes. We appreciate your acts of kindness, and we pray the good Lord to replenish you a million-fold. You all are the reason why we are here, and we are here to serve you better.

Here we are in the season of Lent. During this season the Church is calling on us to return to the Lord with all our heart. While we return to the Lord, we are also called to keep in mind our Lenten observance: prayer, abstinence, and almsgiving.

Lent is a season of prayer. Our Lord is calling on every one of us to pray, so that we may not enter into temptation. In our call for abstinence, the Devil would come our way during this Lenten season to tempt us so as to fall away from our resolution. The things we have planned to give up during this season of Lent, our enemy the Devil would come to tempt us. But with prayer, we will surmount the Devil and win glory to our Lord Jesus. That's why every first Sunday of Lent, the Church, in her wisdom, admonishes her members to reflect on the temptation of our Lord Jesus and how He was able to conquer the Devil through prayer and fasting for forty days and forty nights in the wilderness. Please do not relent on your prayer life during this season.

This is a season in which we all are called to fast from our habitual activities that are not healthy for our spiritual growth. Fasting may be the things we like to eat, which might even lead to gluttony, or the things we like doing, which might be detrimental for our spiritual growth. For my part, I have always tried not to watch soccer during Lent, but I see myself not keeping to that. I will try to work on that during this Lenten season. I would encourage you to offer something up to the Lord during this Lent and see how your life will turn around after Lent. Ask the good Lord to grant you the grace to live out whatever thing you have offered up to Him, so that at the end of Lent, the things we have offered up will reshape our lives and make our lives worthy of emulation.

Our KCC Social Action Committee is making a donation to alleviate poverty in some northern parts of Nigeria that have been ravaged by Boko Haram, a terrorist group in Nigeria. I would encourage you to donate to help our brothers and sisters that have been displaced by Boko Haram. Our parishes are also collecting for Secret Smiles, which provides beds for children in Dayton. Our talents and time could also serve as almsgiving during this Lent. Do not allow Lent to end without caring for the poor and the needy in our midst. Let's be nice and show some acts of charity to people around us.

Have a fruitful Lent and a wonderful Easter in anticipation.
