

JESUS, MITIGATE THE DAMAGE

Jesus has been many things to me throughout the course of my life: Savior, refuge, healer, guide. Most recently, I have come to experience Him as not only my personal redeemer, but also as the redeemer of the whole human story. The older I get, the more I feel the effects of my sins on others, the trauma done to those I love and my own helplessness in fixing what I've broken. In short, I feel the limits of my humanness, finitude and ultimate mortality. My constant prayer: Jesus, mitigate the damage.

What a sobering reality to come to terms with—we can't undo the collateral damage we've done in our own lives or, more seriously, in the lives of others. The story of the past and the role we've played is written, the metaphorical ink dry.

In today's Gospel, Jesus draws a parallel between the image of the brazen serpent that Moses raised up to heal the serpent-bitten Israelites lost in the wilderness, with His own sacrifice on the cross ("so must the Son of Man be lifted up.") So many of us can deeply relate to those Israelites! We, too, are poisoned by the venom of original and generational sins—damage done by those who came before us—and our self-inflicted wounds, desperately in need of some sort of redemption. If simply looking with the eyes of faith at an image of a serpent on a cross raised high could heal the wayward Israelites of their physical afflictions, how much more for us who know, love and believe in the living embodiment of redemption itself? In our second reading, Paul takes it a step further. He reminds the fledgling Church in Ephesus that even in our sinfulness, God's grace has saved us and raises us up with Christ. Despite our humanness, we, too, can participate in the redemption of not only ourselves and our loved ones, but of the entire human story: past, present and future.

Back to my original point. Despite our best intentions, we simply can't make things right. We have no way to turn the clock back to give us a second chance. Our personal story and the story of all mankind is already written. Life allows for no edits. But God, in His infinite wisdom, has more glorious plans for us than an opportunity for a rewrite. In the lifting up of the Son of Man on the cross, He draws all things to Himself, even our human failures.

May we go forward today with the reassurance of the Great Doxology spoken by the presider at the end of our Eucharistic prayer: that through Him all things are assumed, and with Him we join our story to His overarching narrative and in Him all things united are redeemed, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is Yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.

LENTEN ALMSGIVING: SECRET SMILES & CRS IN NIGERIA



Since 2001, **Secret Smiles** of Dayton, Inc. has provided more than 9,700 beds to children in our community who are without. They are a 100% volunteer charity, and every dollar they raise goes back into our community.

They work with local social service organizations, schools, churches, and physicians to locate families in need and ask that they complete the referral form and provide a personal letter. Secret Smiles Board Members review all applications to ensure stability and need. No decisions are made based on race, color, nationality, ethnicity, or creed. Families do not receive cash donations.

Their long-running partnership with Morris Furniture Company allows Secret Smiles to purchase beds at cost with free shipping and delivery. Secret Smiles relies on the local community to raise funds to purchase beds, cribs, and bedding.

The World Bank says the poverty rate in Nigeria increased to 46 percent in 2023. That equates to 104 million poor Nigerians. Poverty is seen in the overcrowded slums, the dilapidated infrastructure, high illiteracy rates, widespread malnutrition and the limited availability to quality healthcare. Each of these aspects of poverty presents its own complex web of problems. The complexity requires many charitable organizations to work together with **CRS in Nigeria** for the greatest possible positive impact.

CRS and its partners have worked in 32 of the country's 36 states and the Federal Capital Territory with an extensive grassroots network and tremendous capacity to reach the rural poor.

Households, communities and farmer groups receive assistance to increase their agricultural production, acquire new skills, diversify their incomes and manage their responses to disturbances

caused by nature and insurgency.

CRS supported the livelihoods of poor and vulnerable smallholder farming households in Borno, Kobe and Adamawa states. That support included improved nutrition; water and sanitation projects that provided access to a reliable supply of clean, piped water; construction and rehabilitation of the infrastructure; strengthening local governance systems; improving access to water for livestock and food production; and delivering extension services to farmers.


MARCH LEISURE CLUB






