

THE HEALING POWER OF CHRIST & HIS CHURCH

As I sat with the Passion Narrative from this Palm Sunday's Gospel readings, I wondered what Jesus was thinking and feeling. The Word became flesh to better relate to us and so that we can better receive His teachings. In today's reading, it is clear that Jesus knows why He is going to Jerusalem and what lay ahead. He says about the lady in Bethany who anointed Him with oil, "She has anticipated anointing my body for burial." When He enters the garden

of Gethsemane, we are told that He was filled with sorrow and distress and that His sweat became like drops of blood on the ground. He begs of God the Father, "Abba, Father, all things are possible to You. Take this cup away from me, but not what I will but what You will." He asks His disciples, His friends, to remain with Him during this difficult, agonizing time. Again, He is showing us His humanity; His agony anticipating the cross He would bear and His wanting His friends, His loved ones, to be near Him in this trial. Then, during the Last Supper, knowing what was to come, He desires to leave something and give something of Himself to those He will "leave behind" after His Passion.

These events reminded me of what I speculate my mother was going through twenty years ago before she passed away. She needed a liver transplant as she had contracted Hepatitis C during a blood transfusion decades earlier when she gave birth to my sister. Although she was on the transplant list, in retrospect it seems she was anticipating dying. She spent hours upon hours putting together all of our old polaroids and photographs into albums for my siblings and me. About six months before she passed, she and I were at a used furniture store finding items for my new apartment. She bought me a little framed sign that said, "A Mother's Love is Forever." That Christmas she also gifted me with a rocking chair. It wasn't until I had given birth to my daughter and used the rocking chair on many sleepless nights, that it hit me. She guessed that she would not be with us if I had children one day, and wanted to leave me with a gift to remember her by; a gift to show that she loved me even if I could not physically have her with me anymore. During mass, as we see the priest elevate the consecrated host, it is a similar reminder. The Eucharist is a gift that Jesus gave us to remind us of His perfect love and of His perfect sacrifice, so that we too, can enjoy eternal life with Him one day in Heaven.
