THE HEALING POWER OF CHRIST & HIS CHURCH

As we make our way through Lent, I want to reflect on one of my favorite Gospels, the Woman at the Well. Like so many of the rich Gospel stories, it can be approached and understood from different perspectives. One of the messages that speaks to me is when the woman leaves Jesus and returns to her town to tell the others of her encounter with our Lord. Prior to this, Jesus had just revealed to her the truth of her state in life (by revealing

His knowledge of her previous five husbands and the state of her current husband). She does not argue or dispute Jesus, but humbly acknowledges the truth of His statements, and in this moment, I believe experiences a healing, or cleansing, of sorts. Further to this, as she is leaving to return to her town to tell others, Jesus does not instruct her to not tell the others. In other Gospel passages, particularly after Jesus heals or cleanses someone, He often instructed the healed to not tell anyone.

In this time of Lent, I believe this Gospel is instructive to us in that Jesus will always speak truth to us, give us the cleansing and healing we so often long for in that truth, and invites us to tell others of the healing power of Christ and His Church.

LENTEN ALMSGIVING: SECRET SMILES & CRS IN NIGERIA



CRS Nigeria programming is launching a long-term solution to the extreme poverty. Sustainable, responsible economic growth and strong social structures are vital in the effort to reduce poverty throughout the country. The CRS Nigeria Country Program is implementing a new strategy to give structure and good practices to achieve that goal. It will be providing technical assistance to local governments and non-governmental partners in Nigeria. The use of technology will optimize the effectiveness and efficiency of multiple agencies working together. This will allow the agencies to monitor and evaluate all the programs in each area of concern. It will give them the tools to check for accountability and reinforce learning requirements. CRS will also implement marketing, communications and business development as this specific program grows.

A CRS program in Nigeria is helping farmers increase their cassava production and their income by 20% through the use of improved cassava varieties.

CRS works with many other international development agencies to serve the needs within Nigeria. In 2023, CRS programs in Nigeria had \$160M in total programming value. In 2022, CRS reached over 80M direct participants, representing one of the largest Country Programs implemented by CRS.



Secret Smiles is committed to improving the quality of life for the families they serve by providing new beds, cribs, and bedding to children in our community who are without. Since 2001, they have been a charity free of salaries, administrative costs, and overhead expenses. Secret Smiles is solely run by dedicated volunteers who believe every child deserves a good night's rest.

Each year, Secret Smiles receives hundreds of letters and emails from families in our community whose children are without beds. Many of these children sleep on cold, hard floors, old mattresses, or couches shared by multiple siblings. They ask these families to work with local social service agencies, school administrators, churches, or medical support teams to complete the Secret Smiles referral application and explain their circumstances. Secret Smiles Board Members carefully review all applications, and thanks to the generosity of many donors, they can help most families.

Secret Smiles also partners with Morris Furniture Company, which enables them to purchase beds and cribs at cost and provides free delivery. Secret Smiles has provided more than 9,700 beds to children in our community.

With your support, Secret Smiles can continue providing more children with hope, peace of mind, safety, security, and beds.

The meeting opened with prayer at 7:30 PM at Ascension.

A) Pastor's report:

- 1) Positive comments from parishioners regarding Fr. Ed's request for reassignment. Posting of the open position has not been sent to priests as of this date. His last weekend to celebrate Masses will be June 15-16. His last day with KCC will be June 19.
- 2) Staffing update: Kristi Gaston will be transitioning from front desk to pastoral associate for liturgy and pastoral care at St. Albert. Interviews continue for the junior high youth minister position. St. Albert's business manager continues to search for a front office person. Sara Schwager, communications, from St. Albert resigned. Currently her duties have been assumed by Anna Godby, the communications person at St. Charles.
