

ON THE JOURNEY

Nine Years ... What a Journey ... Change Is Part of Life

As I enter my last few days with you, I realized that the last nine years have really gone by quickly. Seven years as pastor of Ascension and an additional two years as pastor of our Kettering Catholic Community of St. Albert, St. Charles and

Ascension have been quite a journey! The journey has certainly had its ups and downs, but that is how life is for all. When the Archbishop assigned me to Ascension nine years ago, it was a surprise and a bit of a homecoming since I had completed my seminary internship there. When the Archbishop assigned me as pastor of the Kettering Catholic Community, it was a surprise as well, considering the size (we are the largest family of parishes of the 57 created) and activities at all three of our locations. I trust that you recognize that I loved being in ministry with you—through the good times and the not-so-good times. It has been an honor to be with so many of you during special moments in your lives. It has been a joy to celebrate liturgies with you.

Change is a part of life. The last two years have seen many changes through the Archdiocesan Beacons of Light initiative. It's not been easy all the time, but we have made great progress and I believe the future is bright. The plan is a good one and is needed in order to let our priests be true sacramental leaders who delegate operations to qualified lay persons. We have extremely qualified lay people and I have delegated many things to them. I ask for your support of their work as these people are here to serve all. Father cannot do everything for the parish as he once did. Father cannot be present at more than one place at a time and be at every meeting. It's just not possible. Recognize that we want our priests to be able to prepare homilies, anoint the sick, hear confessions, provide spiritual direction, lead funerals, complete related ministerial responsibilities, but most of all, preside at our Masses so we have the Eucharist. We all have to work together as we change and adapt to let Father be the sacramental minister and let our talented staff do the rest. We also want Father to have time for rest and relaxation.

As I move on, there are so many people to thank that I could not possibly name them all. I am truly thankful to all of you for your support and to those of you whom I may have occasionally disappointed, I apologize and ask your forgiveness. Continue to be supportive of your priests and staff members, recognize times are different and know that the Holy Spirit is guiding us.

Let's continue on our journey with God and one another!

WORD ON FIRE: PAUL'S LETTER TO THE ROMANS

Session 1: What is the Eucharistic Revival and Why Now?

Please join our WOF small group for a new 5-week series to learn more about the National Eucharistic Revival. We will focus on the great gift we have in the Real Presence in the Eucharist. Sometimes we get complacent with the beautiful gift we have in the Eucharist and just let it become an ordinary part of our lives. The Church wants to set us on fire – the meaning of the word "Revival" – and see a fire lit across our country concerning the wonderful gift of redemption the Lord left us at the Last Supper. There is a struggle of hearts and souls for families and especially young people with today's many cultural struggles. We need the grace of Christ's presence in the Eucharist to keep us strong.

We know we are living in an era of faith crises. The latest PEW study revealed that 70% of active Catholics believe the Eucharist is only symbolic. We have seen for many years decreases in Mass attendance and disaffiliation from the Catholic Church. The Church is calling us to stand up to these challenges!

WHAT IS THE NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC PILGRIMAGE?

The "Emmaus Walk" from all four corners of our country began on Pentecost. Pilgrims will walk for 2 months with Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, making a cross over our country – North, South, East and West – ending in Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress.

Each of the routes has a saint's name. Our group is named after Saint Elizabeth Ann Seaton. The East Route begins in New Haven, CT, goes through New York and DC, Steubenville, OH and enters our Archdiocese on Monday, July 1. It will proceed from the Green County Expo Center (Fairgrounds) and arrive at St Brigid's Church around 5 p.m. Following the arrival of the procession at St. Bridgid's Church, a Holy Hour will include a speaker and praise and worship music. Priests will be available to hear confessions. Following the Holy Hour, a community meal will be available for all. 
CYO SOCCER AND GOLF SIGNUPS NOW OPEN

MISSION APPEAL NEXT WEEKEND, JUNE 8-9

They provide free medical checkups and medicine to thousands of needy adults and children. Over the past ten years, FCN has provided free corrective surgeries to more than 2000 children born with cleft lip and cleft palate. CARE FOR GOD'S CREATION

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops have summarized Catholic Social Teaching into seven key themes. The seventh theme is *Care for God's Creation.* "Care for the earth is not just an Earth Day slogan. It is a requirement of our faith. We are called to protect people and the planet, living our faith in relationship with all of God's creation." (USCCB)

The following are some suggestions on how to be good stewards of our planet:

The three guides to our stewardship are: Reduce, Reuse and Recycle.

• We can Reduce the use of plastic by taking our own bags with us when we shop and using refillable water bottles.

• We can save energy by using LED lights and turning off lights and the television when we leave a room.

• Plastic bags can be used again as trash liners or to contain wet closed umbrellas.

• We can Reuse collected rain water for cleaning and watering gardens.

• We can Recycle plastic bags and bubble wrap by returning them to participating store drop-off sites.

• Kitchen scraps can be composted to be used in gardens.

• An excellent opportunity is to fill our pill bottle barrel (in the church atrium) with clean, empty pill bottles to be reused in medical clinics in underdeveloped areas.
