WORD ON FIRE: EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL

Session 4: Food That Gives Eternal Life

Please join our Word On Fire small group this Friday, June 28, 9:15-11 am in the Borromeo Room for a passionate video by Msgr. James Shea, entitled, "Food That Gives Eternal Life," followed by discussion.

The Eucharistic Revival is a privilege for all of us in these difficult times in our culture and our Church, to focus more deeply on Jesus' Real Presence in the Blessed Sacrament. Our Church receives her internal life and growth from the Eucharist. Msgr. Shea notes that belief in the Eucharist can confirm to us that we have 2 solid foundations that we can base the whole of our lives upon:

- 1) Nature of True Faith and allegiance to the spiritual world;
- 2) Real nature of the true Church which we know is going to survive.

Please join us as we discuss Msgr. Shea's Litany of true faith with allegiance to the spiritual world and his great confirmation about the Church Triumphant, Militant and Blessed. He describes Church as the angels seeing it with everyone gathered around Christ as the bridegroom, saints, angels, the Blessed Mother, all the apostles towering over the Church, and all the blessed souls in purgatory. All of these souls are cheering us on and praying for the Church! Our mission as the militants, Msgr. Shea says, is to "Stand up to the resistant and disable the evil we see with great allegiance and trust in God, supported by strength from the Eucharist. We are the smallest part of the Church, a little colony. The Church will survive! It is the world that won't survive. The only thing the evil one can do is make us throw in the towel, but we won't do that! The Church will persevere!"

We don't live for God. We live from God! We don't have to impress God. He is already madly in love with us and desires to come to us and be one with us in the Eucharist and make us strong. Everyone in Heaven is gathered around the throne feasting upon God. At Mass, we are also feasting upon the real Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity of Christ and unite with them. We are called with every Eucharist to carry that presence out into the world. Msgr. Shea says that when everything passes away, we will hold onto a little piece of bread that brings Eternal Life, "THE FOOD THAT BRINGS ETERNAL LIFE!"

MEET FATHER ANTHONY SANITATO, OUR NEW PAROCHIAL VICAR!

I am a Cincinnatian at heart, born and raised in Anderson Township. I was baptized at Immaculate Heart of Mary parish and grew up as a parishioner at St. Rose of Lima parish, while attending St. Ursula Villa for grade school and St. Xavier for high school. I have been blessed with an amazing family of loving parents and three sisters. My family experiences made the vocation of marriage a very attractive option for me. I graduated from Northeastern University and spent a couple of years as a college campus missionary at Florida State University before returning home to Cincinnati.

As a child, the thought of entering seminary was not really on my mind. I remember experiencing great intimacy from altar serving when the opportunity arose around third grade. I enjoyed assisting at school Mass as I appreciated being able to assist the priest as well as the intimacy of being close to the altar for consecration. As neat as the experience was, I soon became more enamored in junior high with the prospect of serving in the military or working in the aviation field. This was also accompanied by a strong desire to get married. My parents set a tremendous example through their marriage and the family they raised, which made the notion of foregoing marriage a tough idea to fathom. This desire for marriage and a family of my own soon surmounted my desire to serve in the military, which did not seem the most conducive for raising the family I wanted to have.

Rather than pursue a career in the military, I enrolled in college and majored in marketing and supply chain management at Northeastern University in Boston. Nonetheless, the best way to make God laugh is to tell Him your plans and expect that to be a forgone conclusion. The Lord has been persistent with me through the love and mercy He has shared with me. My vocation story has been a long one with many twists and turns. One of those turns occurred while at Northeastern University. It was there I met a small religious group, the Brotherhood of Hope, that ran the campus Catholic Center. They assisted me in having a deeper conversion and thinking more intentionally about where God might be calling me in life. I soon became more convicted to know God's specific calling for my life rather than continue to follow my natural inclinations. I remember not wanting to wake up one day after getting married and having children only to have the lingering unanswered question rolling around my head, "Is this truly what the Lord called me to or is this solely my will?" The lack of peace from having this question plagued me and led me to enroll at Mt. St. Mary's Seminary, wanting to give God the time and space needed to guide me to the vocation He wanted for my life. The time in the seminary has given me the clear answer to my initial question, leading me to my priestly vocation.

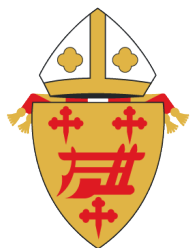
Many priests have been the unsung heroes to my vocation, more than can be named here. Some include my childhood pastor Father Barry Windholtz, Father David Sunberg (my spiritual director prior to and throughout seminary), my formation director Father David Endres, Father Tom McQuillen, Father Tom King, Father Ben O'Cinnsealaigh, Father Paul MacNeil, Father Pat Stenson, Father Chris Komoroski, Monsignor Frank Lane, Father Mark Bredestege, Father Jacob Willig, Father Michael Willig, my internship pastor Father Jerry Hiland, Father Adam Puntel, and Father Daniel Corso.

I am most looking forward to seeing how the Lord uses me in this vocation that He has called me to: drawing others closer to the Lord while also being pulled ever closer as well, and living the adventure the Lord has in store for me. Two of my favorite prayers are the Litany of Humility and the Litany of Trust. As for hobbies, I enjoy aviation and traveling. Ever since I was a little child, I have been in love with aviation. If I was not called to the priesthood, I would love to work in the aviation field. My fascination with aviation is still alive as I love flying on airplanes—the bigger the better!

Please pray for me and my fellow newly ordained for our priesthood. I want to live this call faithfully to bear much fruit for the kingdom. My ultimate goal is to be welcomed into the eternal heavenly banquet feast with the Blessed Trinity.

SOME PRACTICAL HINTS IN WELCOMING OUR NEW PRIEST!

- Be patient with him. The stress of accepting a bigger challenge and the newness of it all can be overwhelming at first.
- Don't beat a path to his door. Give him time to get to know the staff and his way around new spaces.
- Tell him your name and what you're involved with. Not just once or twice, but a number of times. He wants to remember your name, along with the hundreds of other parishioners he's getting to know.
- Let him change his mind. Sometimes a decision made early is rushed and made without fully understanding the situation. It might be necessary to change his mind. Give him some wiggle room.
- Tell him your story, the story of the parish, the traditions, and the important values of the parish. Every parish and tradition in a parish has a story. Stories are important for him to know.
- When he asks how something was done in the past or what the protocol is, refrain from telling him, "Whatever you would like Father." Don't be afraid to tell him how things operate in the parish. Sometimes a new priest doesn't know he has changed anything because no one told him.
- Let him know you and the parish. Be sure to invite him to different parish events. Yes, he may see your event in the bulletin, but an invitation is appreciated!
- Pray for him and let him know you are praying for him. And pray for yourself and other members of the parish as we face the challenges ahead.

Anniversary of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

Today we celebrate the 203rd anniversary of the establishment of our archdiocese (then diocese) by Pope Pius VII. For over two centuries, Catholics in these 19 counties of western and southwestern Ohio have celebrated and shared in our Lord's presence and mission as members of the Mystical Body of Christ, the Church. Throughout these many years, the Church has responded to the pastoral, spiritual, and temporal needs of people, proclaiming the Gospel through word and action. It is fitting, therefore, to mark the anniversary of the establishment of the Archdiocese of Cincinnati by considering how we may continue to grow together as the Church in this time and place.

Beacons of Light highlights the call of every person to actively participate as "a member of a parish, the Universal Church, and our local Church" and to "continually deepen the bond of communion with other parishes." Consistent with this principle, many Families of Parishes recognize the benefit of working together to serve the poor, reach out to those who are homebound, engage young people in the faith, and better use their resources to fulfill Christ's great commission to share the Good News of salvation. Such collaboration in ministry is encouraging. Still, there is even more we can do to further Christ's mission into the future through the parishes and ministries of the archdiocese.

This year, Catholics throughout the United States continue to participate in the National Eucharistic Revival, a three-year movement to deepen understanding and devotion to this great mystery of our faith. As St. Augustine teaches us, the Church and the Eucharist are two facets of the same reality, the Divine Person of Jesus Christ. The Revival invites us to reflect on the gift and fruit of Christ's enduring Eucharistic presence in the Church. Through prayer, reflection, catechesis and celebration, we are reminded of Christ's great sacrifice and our responsibility to give freely and fully in order to share God's love with others.

Our participation in the Eucharist draws us into *metanoia* – a fundamental and enduring change of mind and heart – in order to be more like the One whose Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity we receive in Holy Communion. Change typically is not easy, either for ourselves or for the Church. Yet change is necessary. The circumstances in which the Church operates now are different than they were two hundred years ago, or during any period of time in between. We therefore must consider whether all our resources and activities are properly oriented to helping people encounter Christ and grow more deeply in love with Him through His Church.

On this anniversary of the archdiocese, we pray for a deepening of devotion to our Lord in the Eucharist and that this devotion will foster a greater spirit of unity in our Families of Parishes, our archdiocese and the entire Catholic Church.

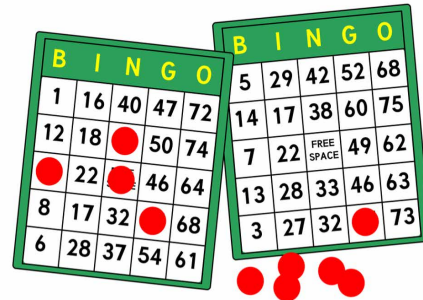

GREENE COUNTY EXPO CENTER, JULY 1, 4:30PM-7AM

Eucharistic procession from Greene County Expo Center (Fairgrounds) to St. Brigid Church on July 1. The procession will begin between 4:30 and 5:00 p.m. Following the arrival of the procession at St. Brigid Church, a Holy Hour is planned that will include a talk from a national Eucharistic speaker and praise and worship music. Priests also will be available to hear confessions. The Holy Hour is planned to take place between about 5:00 and 6:30 p.m. (Actual time is dependent on procession departure and arrival time.) Following the Holy Hour, a community meal will be available for all. The event will feature a display of Eucharistic Miracles by St. Carlo Acutis. After the evening meal and celebration, Adoration and Confession will be available in St. Brigid Church overnight until 7:00 a.m. Tuesday morning.
