


WELCOME ANNIE OUTMAN, YOUTH MINISTER FOR KCC!

WORD ON FIRE: EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL PILGRIMAGE

Session 5: "The Emmaus Walk" (Luke 24:13-28) "Were our hearts not burning when He opened the Scriptures?"

"And they recognized Him in the breaking of the Bread."

These are exciting times for our Church! Jesus is meeting thousands of people on streets, in parks, on lakes, on bridges, in Churches as He is walked across America on the Eucharistic Processions from the four corners of America. The Eastern Seton route was led by Cardinal Dolan across NY City, through Central Park, stopping at the home of Elizabeth Ann Seton, Shrine of Mother Cabrini and then St. Patrick's Cathedral for Mass. Cardinal Dolan boarded a boat, blessing the Statue of Liberty on NY Island carrying the Eucharistic Jesus on his way to NJ. What a great symbol that Lady Liberty is of the freedom we have in worshiping Christ in our country!

The Eastern Procession will be entering our Cincinnati Archdiocese this week when it stops in Xenia at St. Brigid's Church for Adoration, Confessions, praise and worship and dinner. Following overnight Adoration, morning Mass will begin at 7:30 a.m. at St. Brigid's. Afterwards, a Eucharistic Procession will travel to Xenia Station. Along the route there will be a stop at the Greene County Jail to pray outside.

Please join our WOF small group to celebrate this "Emmaus Walk" on Friday morning. We will view a wonderful EWTN video where they are interviewing many young people and others who are walking on this journey to the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis July 17-21. Their witness is awe inspiring! One lady was so in love with Jesus, she was in tears telling about it. The thousands of people, especially young people, in these processions is overwhelming. They stop at numerous Churches on their walk, praying there as they walk for a Eucharistic Revival in our own country and in the world.

The National Eucharistic Pilgrimage is traveling through the Archdiocese of Cincinnati! Join the pilgrims on their journey as they accompany Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament to the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis.

GREENE COUNTY EXPO CENTER, JULY 1, 4:30PM-7AM

Eucharistic procession from Greene County Expo Center (Fairgrounds) to St. Brigid Church on July 1. The procession will begin between 4:30 and 5:00 p.m. Following the arrival of the procession at St. Brigid Church, a Holy Hour is planned that will include a talk from a national Eucharistic speaker and praise and worship music. Priests also will be available to hear Confessions. The Holy Hour is planned to take place between about 5:00 and 6:30 p.m. (Actual time is dependent on procession departure and arrival time.) Following the Holy Hour, a community meal will be available for all. The event will feature a display of Eucharistic Miracles by St. Carlo Acutis. After the evening meal and celebration, Adoration and Confession will be available in St. Brigid Church overnight until 7:00 a.m. Tuesday morning.
