WHAT WOULD SISTER LORETTA DO?

Each year, July 4th rolls around and I begin to experience a little bit of trepidation because I know that school supplies will be loaded on the shelves before the last fireworks have even hit the summer grass. While I am always excited for a new school year, July is my time to unwind and reflect before returning to my duties full time. As I reflect on my road to being principal at Ascension, I go back to where it all started.

As a recent OSU graduate, I began the interview process back in the 80's when there were plenty of applicants, unlike the teacher shortage we are experiencing now. I knew I wanted to teach in a Catholic school, having attended Ascension and Carroll before college. One of my first interviews was with a Catholic school in Dayton that did not have a position for me, but the principal put her hand on my shoulder and said, "Go see my friend, Sister Loretta, in Springfield. I think she may have something for you." Springfield seemed like a different state! I made the long drive – this was before I-675 was built – and met Sister Loretta, Principal of St. Bernard School. She was a force to reckon with, sturdily built and, at first glance, a no-nonsense nun! I would discover I was the youngest in the building at 21 surrounded by seasoned teachers. Sister Loretta allowed me to grow as an educator even when I decided to bring in woks to cook food for my class and blew a fuse so that all the electricity went out in the school! Over time, I grew to admire her strong devotion to her faith, her family, and the school community. As time went on, I would sometimes find myself at the convent eating dinner with her when I had a school function at night instead of going home. We even golfed together with another colleague at the local golf course. She had a mean swing and a hearty laugh. Through those times together, I witnessed Sister Loretta's deep faith and commitment to her life as a Sister of Charity and I often think of what Sister Loretta would do as I sit behind the principal's desk. Her legacy will never be forgotten.

In a few short weeks, our teachers and staff will slowly return to the building bursting with new ideas and energy, ready to support our students and offer them opportunities to know our Lord better. Please include them in your daily prayers so that the promises of a new year may be realized as God's plan unfolds.

MISSION APPEAL NEXT WEEKEND AUGUST 3-4

FROM THE SAFE ENVIRONMENT OFFICE

With summer activities in full swing, we would like to remind all volunteers of the requirements of the Decree on Child Protection. All employees and volunteers are required to have completed The Archdiocese of Cincinnati SafeParish: Protecting Children from Sexual Abuse – Archdiocese of Cincinnati Edition. In addition, employees are required to complete an online background check, manual fingerprinting, and B4 form once prior to beginning employment. Ohio Department of Education licensees may have additional requirements, and school offices or athletic departments should be consulted if there are any questions. Volunteers are required to complete an online background check prior to volunteering with youth. Employees and volunteers are required to stay current in completing SafeParish quarterly bulletins.

With the school year beginning for most in August, please make sure you are up to date on completing the quarterly bulletins or you will not be able to work/volunteer with youth until your SafeParish account is approved.
