

TASTE AND SEE

Our Responsorial Psalm this Sunday, taken from Psalm 34, exhorts us to, "Taste and see the goodness of the Lord."

We can look to the life of the early prophet Elijah as one who, through the course of his life came to taste and see the goodness of the Lord. We begin to see a specific occasion of this in the prophet's life, from the context of our First Reading.

Elijah is sullen as he finds himself beneath a broom tree after his life has been threatened by Jezebel, the wife of the current King of Israel at that time, King Ahab, who is upset with Elijah for slaying the prophets of Baal. Elijah became afraid and fled for his life. Worried about the repercussions he would face for killing the prophets of Baal—who helped Jezebel worship the false idol Baal—he left his servant and traveled a day's journey into the desert where he prayed for death.

Elijah's disappointing plea to God for Him to take his life totally overlooks God's providential plan for Elijah's life. God sees Elijah is steeped in doubt, leading him into despair. This despair overlooks God's love which is anything but abandonment. Rather, God has, is, and will always be accompanying Elijah through the mission to which He called Elijah in his life.

We, too, must have great trust in God's providential care over our lives, especially in the moments when we find it difficult to identify His presence. Not for a millisecond does God ever cease to take His loving gaze off of us. Rather, God is always the loving and providential Father who is always at work to bring about our good. He is always working to bless our lives and bring us closer to His Most Sacred Heart, which does not want our ill but rather looks to sustain us.

This is seen through God sending an angel to deliver a hearth cake and a jug of water to Elijah resting his head under the broom tree. Elijah eats and drinks a little before going back to sleep. God once again sends the angel to Elijah stating, "Get up and eat, else the journey will be too long for you!" Elijah followed the command by getting up, eating, and drinking. Then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb.

Elijah was blessed with the food for his journey. We are all the more blessed on our journeys in life with the True Food and the True Drink that Jesus provides us as His Body and Blood in the Eucharist. The Eucharist provides us with the sustenance needed to traverse through this life on the specific mission that God has called each of us to as His disciple. May we continue to have no fear by trusting in the Lord's loving and providential accompaniment in our lives. May we rely on the heavenly food and drink in the Eucharist as it is adequate nourishment for the journey in this life and into the life to come.

May we taste and see the goodness of the Lord by remaining constant in our feasting on the Eucharist in our lives.
