LETTER FROM FR. TOM

My brothers and sisters in Christ,

At our envisioning/implementation Town Hall meetings, some attendees expressed concern about a lack of transparency, with their voices not being solicited or heard. So, I want to comment on this in the context of a summary of the New Evangelization our Archdiocese has been encouraging for the past twenty years.

Many years ago, our Archdiocese recognized a need for better leadership in encouraging the faithful to full and active participation in the church. To accommodate this, they brought in experts from businesses to share with the church what has worked well in business in pursuit of better participation and performance from personnel. I have experienced three rounds of this: *Good Leaders/Good Shepherds* back in 2010; *Amazing Parish* back in 2018; and our current *Next Generation Parish* initiative.

These initiatives largely encourage the same thing with minor adjustments in timing and emphasis. First, they insisted on having a good Vision Statement that expressed what we wanted to look like in the future, a good Mission Statement that explained how we were going to get there, along with guiding values that would focus and control our efforts. With all of that in place, they then encouraged us to set up priorities and goals for achieving our Vision.

These initiatives focused on setting up committees that would be effective and timely in pursuit of objectives. A key they insisted on for effective and successful committees was a limited number of voices within the committee. They would say, "You need more than three to have a committee, but you never want more than six or seven on a committee." They felt that more than six or seven would stifle the inspirations of the Holy Spirit, while a small number, between four and seven, was very accommodating for the Holy Spirit to work through, provided they were centered in prayer.

I experienced this reality within the Greene County parishes back in 2021. We invited parish council and staff members from all the parishes in Greene County to meet to talk about what our family might look like. We had over thirty people show up for the meeting. Everyone enjoyed meeting the people from other parishes, but the discussions were overwhelming. A lot of great ideas were being presented, but with every new idea brought forward, others need clarification, qualifications, modifications, adjustments, additions, and subtractions. We met for over three hours and when we were done, we were totally exhausted. I think we all left the meeting thinking this is going to be more complicated than we thought.

With too many voices, the discussions get very draining for everyone involved and it takes forever to get to consensus and conclusions. All that stifles the Holy Spirit, while a right number of voices, of prayerful people, is very accommodating to the Holy Spirit. This is not to suggest we don't seek input from everyone, but that happens early on as a starting point for committee discussions. That is what our Disciple Maker Index (DMI) survey from January 2023 was supporting.

I think that is why our Next Generation Parish (NGP) Catholic Leadership Institute (CLI) expert did not promote complete transparency once discussions began. Otherwise, we would have been revisiting former discussions every time we met. The process would have been very draining and slow and could likely have stifled, not supported, the inspirations of the Holy Spirit. We should continue to follow the guidance of our expert as we begin our implementation process, as that guidance seems to be working quite well based on our envisioning results. I am not sure how CLI is going to lead us in implementing our strategies and goals, but based on the great work they have done so far, I believe we need to follow their guidance going forward.
