LETTER FROM FR. TOM

My sisters and brothers in Christ,

In September, as we present our stewardship reports, it is an appropriate time to express a thank-you to all who have given of their time, talents, and treasures in support of our community. Stewardship begins in counting our abundant blessings and acknowledging God as Creator and Giver of all. From that, we grow in motivation to share some of what we have with others as a way of thanking God. The more blessed we are, the more generous we should be. As pastor, I am especially aware and grateful for the generosity that so many have shown. I am confident our future is secure and certain because of the generosity of so many good and holy people in our midst, a sure and certain sign of Christ's presence among us.

During our envisioning/implementation Town Hall meetings, many expressed a desire to have a more beautiful and spiritual name for our Catholic family. We are beginning that process this month with a chance for everyone to recommend a family name through an online survey. We will set up a process to summarize the most recommended names and allow everyone to vote on them. My current two favorites are: Our Lady, Seat of Wisdom, family of parishes; and The Most Sacred and Immaculate Hearts of Jesus and Mary, family of parishes. Watch for more information in the bulletins and on our websites. It will be inspiring to have a Holy Name for our family.

Also in September, we are having a Eucharistic procession to the abortion clinic on Saturday, September 14th. There will be no signs, just people praying in procession. This is not about passing laws, but about praying for changes in hearts so that our culture will grow in a love for new human life and be supportive of new human life from conception to natural death. We will be praying for a culture in which no lady feels a need or pressure to have an abortion but feels totally supported in her pregnancy and confident in her future raising her child. All are invited to be part of this. It begins at 9:00 a.m. at St. Charles and will be over around 10:00 a.m. at the facility. More details will be in the bulletins and on our websites.

We also begin our first meeting with our implementation leaders this month. Everyone we asked to consider being a leader agreed to be a leader with enthusiasm. Another sign of the Spirit's presence amidst us and another reason for optimism. Keep us in your prayers and expect wonderful things flowing from this as we pursue our priorities and goals as a family.




