

LIVE THE ADVENTURE – DISCOVERING OUR VOCATIONS

Do you like going on an adventure and discovering new things? When my kids were growing up I would plan "family fun days." I'd give some clues to what we would be doing that day, but the detailed plan for the day was a secret. This made the day an adventure as my kids discovered the fun plans I tried to create for them. Usually we had a blast and created many great memories as a family.

Lately, I've been reflecting a lot on the many different vocations in my family. A vocation is how God calls you to serve Him in the world. We all have primary lifelong vocations as well as more short-term vocations. In addition to being married and a father, I am in my last year of formation to be ordained a permanent deacon. My wife, Denise, is a mother and has a lay vocation to work in the Church as a musician and catechist. My son, Daniel, is in the seminary and will be ordained a priest in a couple of years. My daughter, Sr. Elizabeth, is pursuing a vocation in religious life with the Mercedarian Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament. My son, Paul, is engaged to be married. My daughter, Maria, is a single lay missionary ministering to the people of Honduras. Finally, my daughter, Monica, is a sophomore in college and is still discerning her primary vocation. Life is full!

Discovering our vocations in life is a lot like going on a "family fun day" that God the Father has planned for us. The Father has a beautiful life adventure planned for each of us to discover. He provides us with clues along the way so we know we are on the right path. He knows it's best for us to gradually discover our lives rather than overpower us with what He has planned for us all at once. For example, if I knew God was calling me to be a deacon 30 years ago, it is likely I would have been overwhelmed and fearful and possibly resisted other life callings meant to prepare me for the diaconate. But now I see how all in my life has been woven together to get me to this point of preparing to be ordained a deacon.

Personally, I love that I don't have to design my own life. It is a joy to discover what God has called me to do. I'm quite sure His plans are a thousand times better than my own! The Father never hides what is good from His children, but He does expect us to be listening in prayer for the many "clues" He so longs to give us. It is also important to have others around us who are listening for "clues" we might miss. Their discernment is a treasure of great value. Parents, especially, are there to encourage their children to pray, listen to God, and explore different vocations so they will know where God is calling them.

We tend to think we are not qualified for our vocations. We may doubt we have what it takes to do what God asks of us. However, "The one who calls you is faithful, and He will also accomplish it" (1 Thes 5:24). Even if we feel our life has been wasted, God can restore it into something beautiful. No situation is beyond God's power and love. Do not be afraid. Discover your vocations. LIVE THE ADVENTURE!

MASS AND PARTISAN POLITICS

Presidential election years cause much polarization even within the worshiping community. As we gather for Mass each week, it is important to remember that our primary purpose is to worship God and deepen our faith. Therefore, we kindly ask that all political discussions and expressions be set aside while on church premises. Please refrain from bringing partisan literature to the church for distribution or placing them without permission on church bulletin boards. Additionally, please refrain from wearing caps, buttons, ties, and other items that display partisanship within the church. While we recognize that the Church encourages us to live out our faith in all areas of life, including civic engagement, and that each person is called to form their own conscience (https://ivotecatholic.org), our focus during Mass should be on our relationship with God and with one another as a faith community where all feel welcomed and loved.

Meanwhile, you might be interested in the Archdiocesan series about the Eucharist as a way to overcome polarization called "Our Eucharistic Mission in a Polarized World." One of these sessions will be in our family of parishes on September 23 at 7:00 p.m. at St. Charles Borromeo Church.

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation. Let us continue to pray for wisdom, compassion, and guidance in all aspects of our lives.
