

STAFF REFLECTION

We live in a messy world, don't we? The Holy Land is seemingly on the brink of all-out war, a state Russia and the Ukraine have been in for almost 2 ½ years. There are over a dozen countries across the world in the midst of civil wars; South Sudan is embroiled in ethnic cleansing; and even long-stable nations are dealing with terrorist uprisings. Our own country is nearing the end of a

presidential campaign in which one candidate ascended to the nomination without a primary, and the other survived two assassination attempts. Helene has left a trail of destruction unlike anything we've seen in decades, and hurricane season has just begun.

We argue about whether climate change is real, if vaccinations work, and who should be eligible to play women's sports. Sometimes it seems like everyone is ripe for a fight, and everything is a possible battleground. Even school levies have become ideological dogfights. And don't get me started about the toxic effects of social media and the use of algorithms and AI to manipulate culture. (Remember the halcyon days when social media was used to find long lost friends and take pictures of food?)

I'll be honest, sometimes I get so frustrated with the nonsense around us that I pray for Jesus to come again and take us all home. But as much as I long for the day when I'll see Jesus face to face, I think this weekend's first reading offers us another way to navigate the waters of our present age. Our author prays for wisdom and prudence, proclaiming that they are to be treasured over power, wealth, beauty, and status. Prudence, of course, is one of the four cardinal virtues. It's the habit that enables us to see what is virtuous and what is not, and helps us to avoid evil and choose the good. Thomas Aquinas tells us that Wisdom, one of the seven gifts of the Holy Spirit, completes and perfects the virtues by helping us to judge human affairs according to divine truth. It seems to me that if ever we needed Prudence and Wisdom, it is now. Today.

Can you imagine if the leaders of Hamas, Hezbollah, Israel and Iran sat down together to decide the wisest, most prudent way to handle border disputes and governance? Putin and Zelenskyy discussing the best ways to avoid evil and do good? Can you imagine what a Presidential race would look like if both candidates were such pillars of Prudence and Wisdom, and so in tune with the will of God, that we wrung our hands over choosing the greater of two goods? Heck, a world where Tik Tok and Meta were platforms for virtuous and charitable discourse? Yeah, neither can I. But I can imagine a world in which I act more prudently. I can imagine myself both desiring and seeking the will of God in all I think, say, and do. I may not be able to change the world, but with the grace of God, I can invite Him to change me. It's what the author of Wisdom does, and it's what we all can do as well.

May God grant us Prudence and Wisdom, and may we conform ourselves to the will of God in all we do and all we are.
