STAFF REFLECTION

I, along with my wife Joanne, have been a member of St. Albert the Great parish for over 35 years. I have found Saint Albert to be a very spiritual-filling parish. I thank Saint Albert parishioners as they stood by me and my family. They assisted me with their prayers as I went through the seminary and was ordained permanent Deacon in 2007. When I was transferred in 2014 to go up north to help a parish in Russells Point who didn't have any clergy assigned to it, it was a very difficult move to make. When I was finally able to transfer back to the Kettering area, we were very excited to be coming home, because this is truly our home where we feel welcomed.

Back before Covid, the Catholic Churches were strong and well-attended. Since Covid, the number of parishioners attending Mass has diminished. We as Christians should feel free to come back to the church and make our faith known to not just ourselves, but to our children and grandchildren as well.

One way that I can think to make this happen is to go back to our dedication to the Blessed Virgin Mary. Our dedication to her through our prayers can help the Kettering Catholic Community to grow strong again, and to be the enlightenment to the community in which we live.

As we remember our education in the role that Mary played in Jesus' life from the time the angel Gabriel came to Mary and announced that she was going to give birth to the Son of God, to her raising Jesus as a child and her standing by her son at the time of His public ministry at the wedding of Cana to His sacrificing of Himself on the cross, she was always a support to Him. "His will be done" was her response to the angel Gabriel and I think that was her thought throughout her life. Jesus gave us His mother to be our Christian mother in guidance of our life.

No one who has ever prayed to Mary has been left with their prayer unanswered. We need to pray for her intervention in helping us grow stronger in faith, love and dedication to our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. The stronger we grow in our faith, the stronger we grow in our love for God, and the more we stand out as the Christians that we are called to be. Jesus sent out His disciples to teach the world about God and His love for us. I'm asking everyone in the Kettering Catholic community to dedicate time each day to prayer.

CHANGING THE NAME OF KETTERING CATHOLIC COMMUNITY

At the recent Town Halls, several parishioners expressed a desire for a more sacred name of our Family of Parishes. With that in mind, we have developed an online survey for parishioners and school students to suggest names (within the parameters noted below) and the reason for that suggestion. The survey is currently active and will close on September 30.

At that time, the results will be tabulated, and will be shared with the Family Leadership Team. Five names will then be selected for ballot box voting from October 26 to November 1. The winning name will be submitted to the Chancery at the Archdiocese for acceptance of our new Family name. A public announcement will be made following the acceptance by the end of November. Our new Family name may or may not become the name of our one canonical parish, which likely will not happen for several years. That will need to be approved by whomever Pope Francis names as Archbishop Schnurr's successor once his retirement becomes official. While considering name ideas, keep in mind:

PRAY: We ask that you prayerfully discern a name that will represent all three of our parishes.

MAY be

- a name of the Blessed Virgin Mary (under some title already approved for use in the liturgy, such as Our Lady of ***)
- the name of a saint, or the name of an angel. The name must be a heavenly patron who will intercede for us and whom we can invoke in prayer.

MAY NOT be the name of a "Blessed"; without special permission of the Vatican (i.e. Blessed Carlo Acutis)

MAY NOT be:

• one of the three Divine Persons since they are not intercessors.

KCC FALL ANOINTING OF THE SICK

"Is anyone sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church and the priests will pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord and the prayer of faith will save the sick person and if they are in sin, they will be forgiven."

- James 5:14-15

St. Charles will celebrate the KCC Fall Anointing of the Sick on Saturday, October 5th after the 5:00 p.m. Mass. We invite all to join us who can benefit from this sacrament. If you have questions or need the sacrament at another time, please call the St. Charles office at 937-434-6081.

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of healing. The emphasis has changed significantly since the Second Vatican Council from an anointing for the dying person to help prepare them for heaven, to an anointing of grace so that the sick person may follow the example of Christ and so persevere as Christ persevered. Now, as soon as one begins to be in danger of death due to old age or illness, or are struggling, spiritually and physically with their illness, they are candidates for anointing. "If a sick person who received this anointing recovers his health, he can in the case of another grave illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated. It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation. The same holds for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1515).




