

NOW THAT THE 10TH NATIONAL EUCHARISTIC CONGRESS HAS ENDED, WHAT DO WE DO NOW?

The answer to this question is found repeatedly in Scripture. Here are some examples:

From Jesus' Resurrection: The Commissioning of the Disciples after Jesus' Resurrection (Matt. 28:19-20) – "Go, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of

the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age."

As Jesus said to Peter: (Matt. 16:18) "And so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church ..."

To the Ascension: (in Acts 1:8-11) – "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth. When he had said this, as they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight. While they were looking intently at the sky as he was going, suddenly two men dressed in white garments stood beside them. They said, "Men of Galilee, why are you standing there looking at the sky?"

To Pentecost: (Acts 1:13-14) when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, Mary, and other women, who were given the gift of language.

To the final words from Bishop Cozzens at the last Mass of the National Eucharistic Congress on July 21st: "Go, don't stay. Go and tell others about the gift that you have received." (EWTN.com/Eucharist, watch on demand)

With the above having been said, we may already know what we are supposed to do. Now is the time to take the time to find a quiet place to reflect on what God is calling each of us to do in order to carry out our own specific "mission" that has been given to each of us. We can do this, but it won't be easy. We already have what we need: we were baptized with the Holy Spirit and sealed at Confirmation.

Therefore, let us push forward and not fall back into complacency, for the world needs us now to stand up and do what we need to do: GO THEREFORE, AND MAKE DISCIPLES OF ALL THE NATIONS AND TEACH THEM TO OBSERVE ALL THAT I HAVE COMMANDED YOU. AND BEHOLD, I AM WITH YOU ALWAYS, UNTIL THE END OF THE AGE.

So, what are we waiting for?

CHANGING THE NAME OF KETTERING CATHOLIC COMMUNITY

At the recent Town Halls, several parishioners expressed a desire for a more sacred name for our Family of Parishes. With that in mind, we have developed an online survey for all adults, children, and teens who are connected to our churches and schools to suggest names (within the parameters noted below) and the reason for that suggestion. The survey is currently active and will close on October 7. We value your input and hope you will submit a name nomination.

The results from the survey will be tabulated, and shared with the Family Leadership Team. Five names will then be selected for ballot box voting in mid-November. The final name chosen will be submitted to our pastor and the Chancery at the Archdiocese for acceptance. A public announcement will be made following the acceptance by the end of December. Our new Family name may or may not become the name of our one canonical parish, which likely will not happen for several years. That will need to be approved by whomever Pope Francis names as Archbishop Schnurr's successor once his retirement becomes official.

While considering name ideas, keep in mind:

- PRAY: We ask that you prayerfully discern a name that will represent all 3 of our parishes.
- MAY be a name of the Blessed Virgin Mary (under some title already approved for use in the liturgy, such as Our Lady of ***) the name of a saint, or the name of an angel. The name is a heavenly patron who will intercede for us and whom we can invoke in prayer.
- MAY be the name of an essential mystery of the faith (e.g., Ascension, Assumption, Nativity)
- MAY NOT be the name of a "Blessed"; without special permission of the Vatican (i.e. Blessed Carlo Acutis) MAY NOT be one of the three Divine Persons since they are not intercessors.

KCC FALL ANOINTING OF THE SICK

"Is anyone sick among you? Let them send for the priests of the Church and the priests will pray over them, anointing them with oil in the name of the Lord and the prayer of faith will save the sick person and if they are in sin, they will be forgiven."

- James 5:14-15

St. Charles will celebrate the KCC Fall Anointing of the Sick on Saturday, October 5th after the 5:00 p.m. Mass. We invite all to join us who can benefit from this sacrament. If you have questions or need the sacrament at another time, please call the St. Charles office at 937-434-6081.

Anointing of the Sick is a sacrament of healing. The emphasis has changed significantly since the Second Vatican Council from an anointing for the dying person to help prepare them for heaven, to an anointing of grace so that the sick person may follow the example of Christ and so persevere as Christ persevered. Now, as soon as one begins to be in danger of death due to old age or illness, or are struggling, spiritually and physically with their illness, they are candidates for anointing. "If a sick person who received this anointing recovers his health, he can in the case of another grave illness receive this sacrament again. If during the same illness the person's condition becomes more serious, the sacrament may be repeated. It is fitting to receive the Anointing of the Sick just prior to a serious operation. The same holds for the elderly whose frailty becomes more pronounced" (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 1515).

A MESSAGE FROM FINANCE COUNCIL

The past fiscal year brought some welcome financial news for our parish and school. Most notably, we received two separate, anonymous donations through the Dayton Foundation which totaled over \$600,000. As these were unexpected, we had not planned for them within our budgeting process for this past fiscal year. We are discussing how best to use these generous gifts in the coming year. Ideas include significant repairs and improvements to the church interior and resurfacing of the parking lot.

After several years of declining contributions, we are pleased to report that contributions remained steady this year. The school saw an increase in revenue due to the expansion of Ohio's EdChoice Scholarship Program. This increase enabled the school to absorb costs that had been previously been covered by COVID funding which ended with the '22-'23 school year. The surplus funding from operations was largely driven by the change in EdChoice funding and savings on the salaries and benefits line.

We are grateful for the generosity of our parishioners and we strive to be good stewards of your gifts. We are optimistic about our future and our ability to serve the needs of our parish and our community.


