# **STAFF REFLECTION**

Here we are, in the midst of winter. Now that the festive lights, decorations, and music of Christmas are all packed away, we are left with seemingly endless cold and darkness. Many find themselves sinking into the dreariness, finding it harder to see the light that lies ahead in the coming months. A couple of lines from the hymn *Christ Be Our Light* come to mind:

"Longing for light, we wait in darkness... Christ be our light! Shine in our hearts. Shine through the darkness."

In today's Gospel, Jesus reminds us that He is the ultimate light. While preaching in His hometown synagogue, Jesus reads from the prophet Isaiah, saying, "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me, because He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to captives and recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, and to proclaim a year acceptable to the Lord."

I can imagine myself amongst the crowd, waiting patiently to hear Jesus speak, whose teachings were becoming well known across the land. When He spoke, He delivered one of the shortest yet most life-altering homilies ever: *"Today, this Scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing."* I can see my eyes growing wide as commotion starts erupting in the hall. My brain is frantically trying to comprehend what I just heard... thinking, "Wait... what?" As we continue in Luke's Gospel, we hear that the people rejected Him and drove Him out of town.

On that day, the scripture became real. It was no longer something to just believe in. It was standing right there in front of them. Jesus was there to free us from the captivity of our sins, from our darkness and oppression. Jesus was, and still is, the light. In the darkness of winter, may we turn to Jesus and allow Him to shine His light upon us so we can shine brightly for each other.

"Awake from your slumber! Arise from your sleep! A new day is dawning for all those who weep. The people in darkness have seen a great light. The Lord of our longing has conquered the night. Let us build the city of God. May our tears be turned into dancing! For the Lord, our light and our love, has turned the night into day!" ~ City of God by Dan Schutte



# ACTS XXIX: SPARK YOUR CORE FAITH SET IT ABLAZE IN 2025!

"All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting, and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." (II Timothy 3:16-17)

# Session 3: HOW AND WHY SHOULD I READ THE BIBLE?

The Bible is our most precious book, most powerful book, the most popular book. Bishop Barron says in the introduction of Dei Verbum (The Word of God), "Vatican II's document on revelation, is the single importance in the life of the Church, since it speaks of the process by which God communicates to his people. The entire purpose of this communication is to draw us into friendship and a deeper love relationship with God." What could be more significant for all believers?

The Council Fathers recognized the need for a renewal when it came to reading and appreciating the Bible. They called for a greater study of the Bible among lay people, placing sacred writings at the center of the liturgy. (9D24) Bishop Barron feels that dream is still largely unrealized. We need to hear God's Word with reverence to know Him better and are called to proclaim it with faith to others.

# ST. DYMPHNA PRAYER SERVICE FOR MENTAL HEALTH

The winter months can be difficult for many people. This service is for anyone who battles or is praying for those struggling with anxiety, depression, and mental health issues. We invite everyone to join us on Sunday, January 26, at 2:00 p.m. as we pray for the intercession of St. Dymphna, the patron saint of mental health. The service will be held in the Adoration Chapel at the Maria Stein Shrine and will include prayers and veneration of St. Dymphna's relic. Speaking at the service will be Nick Clune, a certified CPMAP Mentor trained through the CatholicPsych Institute. Nick specializes in helping men and women build fulfilling relationships, overcome anxiety and depression, and discover deeper meaning in life through the integration of psychology, spirituality, and Catholic anthropology.

A key part of the law Moses receives from God on Mt. Sinai is the concept of Jubilee, described in Leviticus 25. Every seventh year was to be a year of Subbath rest for the land. During these Sabbath years, fields were to lie fallow, and God promised He would provide food from the seeds left on the ground from prior harvests. When this pattern had been completed seven times, the fiftieth year was to be a year of Jubilee—a celebration of all that God had done. In these years of Jubilee, not only did the ground lie fallow, but debts were forgiven and slaves freed. All this was to help the Israelites remember that everything comes from God and will return to God. In this Jubilee Year of Hope, we remember that we, too, came from God and are meant to return to Him.
