BY ANY OTHER NAME...

Many of my treasured phone calls and text messages begin with “Hi, Mom.” Over the years, I have turned my head to many different titles: daughter, sister, wife, coworker, neighbor, friend. I wear each title like a warm blanket, as each becomes a part of who I was, who I am, and who I am called to be as a child of God.

My husband and I had a plan to start a family “in due time” after our wedding. The plan was to continue putting savings toward the purchase of a home, to grow in our career fields, to enjoy time together. I think we said maybe 5 years down the road. Proverbs 16:3 tells us to “Commit to the Lord whatever you do, and he will establish your plans.” We had our first child before our third anniversary, and in four years we were parents to three children. I received a new title.

My recollection of the early years is that I wanted to be “that” Mom, the one who seemed to have it all together, in spite of the demands of an active household. I quickly learned that person didn’t exist, certainly not in our house. If you embrace the role of a parent to the best of your ability, you’ll be rising well before dawn to shower before the chaos begins; you’ll sometimes look “spot on,” but most days you’ll throw on whatever you find first in the drawer. You’ll swear up and down you won’t let your child control what you put on the table and then turn around and cut the crusts off the sandwich and peel the apple slices (mind you, they loved them the day before). You’ll pick and choose your battles in an attempt to keep everyone happy; when you fail, your husband will remind you that you’re human and a wonderful parent and spouse.

One particularly trying day, I was feeling overwhelmed and trying to keep my emotions from getting the best of me. At one point, one of the kids pushed my last button. I announced Mommy wasn’t available, that she needed a few minutes in her room. Within minutes, our middle son, 3 at the time, was at the bedroom door. He knocked and said “Mommy?” to which I replied, “Mommy’s not available, she needs a few minutes...” The next knock came quickly and before I could say a word, he said “Is Elizabeth here?” It’s exactly what I needed to get back to being Mom again that morning.

On this Mother’s Day weekend, our Mother of God Family of Parishes gives thanks to all those who live out the virtues of motherhood: unconditional love, unwavering support, patience and selflessness.

Approximately 50-75% of the food that most pantries in the Miami Valley receive is from the Dayton Food Bank, including the Catholic Social Services pantry and the Neighbor-to-Neighbor pantry, run by Ascension and Greenmont-Oak Park Church. This means, for the foreseeable future, the pantries will be dependent on donations of nonperishable food items from people like you. The primary need is for food items as opposed to toiletries or cleaning products. Thank you for your amazing generosity in supporting our neighbors in need!

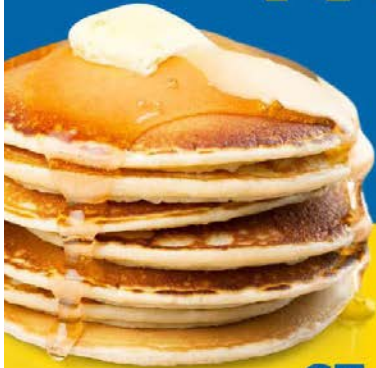

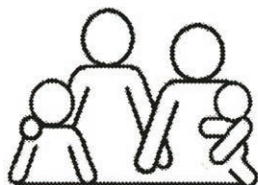
