- **Plan Ahead** Please submit all communication and marketing requests to all three coordinators as early as possible—ideally *at least* two to three weeks in advance. Early submissions allow us time to plan, design, and coordinate your request across our various platforms, as applicable.
- Make It Meaningful Your wording matters! Use inviting and engaging language that answers the who, what, when, where, and why. Avoid overly formal or vague descriptions. Think about what would make someone feel welcomed or inspired to attend or participate. Trust our communication team to edit the wording as needed for consistency and space constraints. We want your item to get noticed as much as you do!
- **Keep It Clear and Concise** Try to keep your content short and to the point. We may need to edit for space or clarity, but submitting clean, well-written copy helps us represent your message accurately.
- Use Quality Graphics—or Let Us Help Great visuals draw attention. If you have a flyer or image, please ensure it's high-resolution and appropriate. Not sure how to design it? No problem—our communications team is happy to assist or create something for you.
- Think Beyond the Bulletin In addition to the bulletin, consider sharing your event by word of mouth, group emails, your social media, or meetings. A multichannel approach helps your message reach more people. Our communication team can also adapt your request for our various channels, ensuring a unified message and consistency.
- **Be Patient and Understanding** We receive many requests each week and do our best to accommodate everyone. Please be patient and know we're working hard to support all ministries and ministry partners fairly and effectively.

Session 6: What Difference Does It Make (The Passion, Death, and Resurrection)


Fr. Riccardo says, and we know, "It changes everything!" He says that by Jesus death and glorious Resurrection from the dead, Jesus:

- Humiliated the enemy. Satan has no more power over us if we are in Christ.
- Destroyed death and rescued us. We are no longer bound by fear of death.
- Transferred us from the kingdom of darkness to the Kingdom of Light. This happens if you are baptized. This is why we baptize.
- Gave us access to the Father. "Through (Jesus) we...have access in one Spirit to the Father." (Ephesians 2:18)
- Recreated us: "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has passed away, the new has come." (II Corinthians 5:17) So, look forward!
- · Rendered sin impotent, filled us with grace: "By the Holy Spirit, we can now live entirely new lives, no longer stuck in sinful habits."
- Gave us authority over the enemy: You are not helpless.
- Sends us on a mission to get his world back: "Go into the world and preach the Gospel to the whole creation." (Mark 16:15) We are now equipped to fight! 

Pope Leo XIV was born September 14, 1955, in Chicago, Illinois. He holds a bachelor's degree from the Augustinian-run Villanova University in Pennsylvania and joined the order in 1977, making his solemn vows in 1981.

He joined the Augustinian mission in Peru in 1985 and largely worked in the country until 1999 when he was elected head of the Augustinians' Chicagobased province. From 2001 to 2013, he served as prior general of the worldwide order. In 2015, Pope Francis named him bishop of Chiclayo, in northern Peru, and the pope asked him also to be apostolic administrator of Callao, Peru, from April 2020 to May 2021.

Pope Francis elevated him to Cardinal in the Consistory of September 30, 2023, when he was assigned Cardinal of St. Monica. On February 6, 2025, Pope Francis promoted him to the highest degree of Cardinals, granting him the title of the Suburbicarian Church of Albano.

On May 8, 2025, Cardinal Protodeacon Dominique Mamberti pronounced the formula, "Habemus Papam," proclaiming to the city of Rome and to the whole world the news of the election of Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost as Pope Leo XIV.



MAY FOOD PANTRY COLLECTION

The next collection of items for the Ascension Neighbor-to-Neighbor Food Pantry will be held on the weekend of May 17/18. UPDATE ON DONATIONS FOR FOOD PANTRIES: As you may have heard, the federal government has cut millions of dollars from US food banks effective immediately. This means hundreds of trucks full of food headed to food banks will go undelivered. Sadly, this is affecting the Dayton Food Bank and the many local pantries it serves, as well as farmers who are paid to provide their crops to US food banks. Approximately 50-75% of the food that most pantries in the Miami Valley receive is from the Dayton Food Bank, including the Catholic Social Services pantry and the Neighbor-to-Neighbor pantry, run by Ascension and Greenmont-Oak Park Church. This means, for the foreseeable future, the pantries will be dependent on donations of nonperishable food items from people like you. The primary need is for food items as opposed to toiletries or cleaning products. Thank you for your amazing generosity in supporting our neighbors in need!

LOVE IN ACTION

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL/NEIGHBOR OUTREACH QUARTERLY SUMMARY

The Mother of God Family of Parishes parishioners' generous support of our neighbors during this last quarter continues to demonstrate the strong tradition of a caring and sharing Family of Parishes. During this past quarter, the MGFP St. Vincent de Paul Conference and Neighbor Outreach members responded to 238 calls for assistance, logging 243 service hours and 672 miles. We provided assistance to 114 households and more than 130 neighbors, including many children. The ministry provided 34 rental payments and made payments for 53 households with past-due utility notices. More than 600 lunches were packed for St. Vincent Men's Shelter. Home visits, furniture vouchers, gas cards, and appliance assistance was also provided to our neighbors.

Among the many calls for assistance, we would like to bring to your attention to two in particular. The first, we received from our neighbor Beth. A local factory employee, she lost her job after 16 years in a plant shutdown in 2022. While she attempted to find another job, she ran through unemployment, then her 401(K). She worked for a while, but lost that job in December of 2024. Struggling with her health, she is undergoing medical treatment so she can return to work. Beth needed assistance with both her electric and gas bill. She had been on a payment plan, but ran short of funds and had received a disconnect notice for gas and was in danger of falling out of her plan for electric. One of our volunteers was quickly able to assess the situation and make contact with the utility companies and provide payments to prevent the disconnect and continue the electric plan program. Beth was overwhelmed by your support and assistance.

From another household, we received a call from a family that was facing a number of financial issues. Bob was out of work as a bricklayer. His mother had recently passed and the care for his developmentally disabled younger brother was passed on to him. Bob had several large utility bills in need of payment. One of our conference members was able to guide Bob through the process to set up payment plans. Assistance was made for his gas bill to start the program. The family was very grateful for the support provided.

We are always seeking additional volunteers. We have many roles that help us serve our neighbors, and will provide training and plenty of time for you to discern whether the Lord is calling you to this ministry.
