THE GIFT OF GOD'S LOVE



Today, the Catholic Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. There are many things to marvel at about the mystery of the Holy Trinity. The aspect that speaks to me most powerfully is that the relationship between the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit is a relationship of love. Today is about celebrating the awesomeness of

the love the Three Persons of the Trinity share. That love is so great, God wants to share it with us! It is so abundant that He pours it out on us, not just once, but over and over again throughout our lives.

God shares His love for us in many, many ways. But for me, there are two ways that really reveal what God's love is. The first is the gift of family. We know that family is important to God, because the Trinity is a family, and because Jesus was born into a family - the Holy Family. God intends for us to be part of His family, to learn how to love and be loved, so that we can share His love with others. Families can show us what it means to love as God loves.

The second is the gift of the sacraments. It is through the sacraments that we enter into God's family and encounter His love in very special ways. God made us! He understands that we need the sacraments so that we can receive His grace in ways our senses can grasp. Each sacrament is an opportunity to experience God's infinite, abundant love for us!

These two ways of encountering God's love are special to me because they have been at the heart of my work at St. Charles over the past 15 years. At the end of June, I will be retiring as the Pastoral Associate for Children's Faith Formation at St. Charles. I want to thank all the families that have allowed me to accompany them as they raise their children in our faith! I am grateful to have been a part of close to 900 Baptisms, 900 First Communions and 500 Confirmations. I have had the joy of teaching children through Children's Liturgy of the Word, CCD, and Bible Camp. I have been blessed to work with awesome catechists who generously dedicate their time and talent to teaching our parish children. In each of you, I have experienced what it means to be part of God's loving family. I pray that you will continue to grow in your love of the Lord. His love for you will never end!

POLICY ON PYXES IN COMMUNION LINE

EFFECTIVE JUNE 21, 2025

"In the Archdiocese of Cincinnati, those who take Communion to the sick and homebound are to be called forward after the Prayer After Communion. The minister receives the pyx with the appropriate number of Hosts at that time and are sent forth by the community. Therefore, hosts are not to be placed in a pyx in the Communion procession." (*This Holy and Living Sacrifice*, 2018)

St. Albert and St. Charles already follow this practice, but it is new for Ascension. Beginning the weekend of the Feast of Corpus Christi, June 21-22, 2025, Ascension will also begin to follow the directive from the Archdiocese of Cincinnati. This will apply only to weekend liturgies at Ascension. Daily Mass procedures at Ascension will be changed at a later date.

Clean, open pyxes should be placed on the tray on a table in the baptistry before Mass begins. Pyxes are available to be signed out in the Lay Ministers' Room.

Laminated cards will be on the tray with a dry erase marker. Each person will fill out the information (their name and number of hosts) on one card and place it with the open pyx.

As Communion ends, an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC), the priest, or deacon will place the appropriate number of hosts in each pyx and close it.

Near the end of Mass, those taking Communion to the homebound will be called forward to retrieve their pyx from the tray.

If a pyx is brought in the Communion line, the minister will quietly ask to meet you in the chapel after Mass to obtain the hosts from the Tabernacle. Those who do not wish to use the tray may approach an EMHC or staff person after Mass to receive hosts in a clean pyx. Thank you in advance for your understanding as we align closer to the norms from the Archdiocese of Cincinnati.

JUNE FOOD PANTRY COLLECTION

The next collection of items for the Ascension Neighborto-Neighbor Food Pantry will be held next weekend, June 21/22. UPDATE ON DONATIONS FOR FOOD PANTRIES: As you may have heard, the federal government has cut millions of dollars from US food banks, effective immediately. This means hundreds of trucks full of food headed to food banks will go undelivered. This is affecting the Dayton Food Bank and the many local pantries it serves, as well as farmers who are paid to provide their crops to US food banks. Approximately 50-75% of the food that most pantries in the Miami Valley receive is from the Dayton Food Bank, including the Catholic Social Services Pantry and the Neighbor-to-Neighbor Pantry, run by Ascension and Greenmont-Oak Park Church. This means, for the foreseeable future, the pantries will be dependent on donations of nonperishable food items from people like you. The primary need currently is for food items as opposed to toiletries or cleaning products. You may drop off your donations in the bride's room at Ascension or at the entrances of St. Charles and St. Albert. Thank you for your amazing generosity in supporting our neighbors in need!
